### Our Speaker

Tommie Lindsey

In September our speaker will be Tommie Lindsey. For more than 25 years, Lindsey has worked with students in the California public school system. In 1988 he started teaching at Logan High School where he is the Head Coach of their Speech and Debate Team.

As a 2004 MacArthur Foundation Fellow, Tommie Lindsey is changing the landscape of opportunities for at-risk students. In his forensics program at Logan High School, he instills in his students the importance and power of persuasion, based on clear communication, reasoning, and mastery of the facts. American high school forensics is dominated by a small number of schools located primarily in the most affluent areas of the country; by contrast, many of Lindsey's students come from poor families, broken homes, or difficult urban environments. He has repeatedly demonstrated that students can surmount these circumstances by force of character, personal experience, hard work, and commitment to excellence. By showing his students that they can compete intellectually at the highest levels and teaching them skills they can use throughout their lives, he has recast the imaginative possibilities for hundreds of young women and men; more than 90% of his students go on to attend college.

The subject of a PBS documentary *Accidental Hero*; room 408, Lindsey was featured on the "News Hour with Jim Lehrer" in 2002, and he received an Angel Network Use Your Life Award from Oprah Winfrey in 2003. Selected as the California State Teacher of the Year in 1994, Lindsey was then honored by the National Forensic League as their National Coach of the Year.

Mr. Lindsey will talk to us about his forensics class at James Logan High School. He is bringing a couple of his students to the meeting.

## Edited Excerpts from August 18th Minutes of Al Wydler



A special meeting of the Executive Board was held, at 9:30 am, to discuss methods of defraying increased charges announced by Swiss Park.

At this meeting various suggestions were considered such as, a quarterly raffle, charging all members a pro-rated sum to cover insurance costs, selling "door prize" tickets or a collection basket. Most of these were considered unreliable or unfair to those who are legitimately absent from the luncheon. A decision was made to increase the lunch charge to \$11.00 and social events to \$18.00. This should enable our net balance to remain within State SIR recommendations.

The regular meeting of the Executive Board was called to order at 10:20 am.

Following The Pledge of Allegiance, roll call showed 5 officers and 6 directors to be present.

The Minutes of July 21 were accepted.

Big Sir Howie Thompson informed the Board that Tom Sherba was elected Governor, Area 8, for the year of 2006. He advised us to read SIR Happenings, especially page 10, and proudly announced that Branch 59 is ranked eighth by the State. The July open seating arrangement was satisfactory.

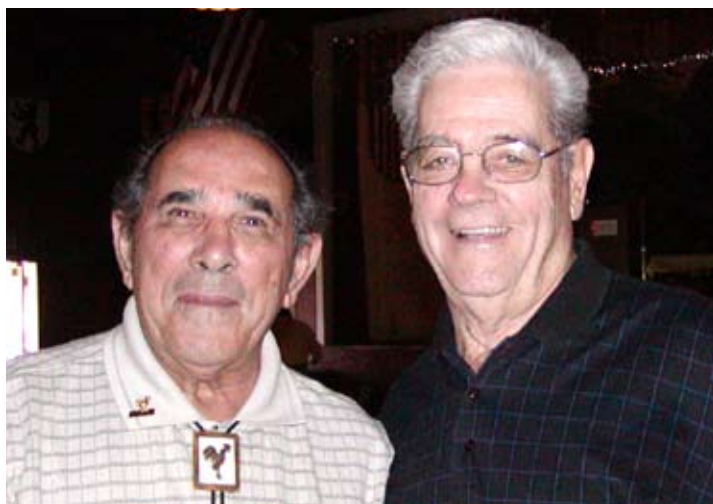


#### October 23 - November 5: CRUISE CANADA & COLONIAL AMERICA
