Our Speaker Shawon Dunston By Little Sir Les Addison

Our speaker for October is Shawon Dunston who was a major league short stop for 18 years. The Chicago

Cubs made Dunston the first pick in the nation in the 1982 June draft after he batted .790 as a senior at Brooklyn's Thomas Jefferson High. In 1986, he led the NL shortstops in put outs, assists, double plays, and home runs (17). He was an All Star in 1988 and 1990 and was a key contributor to the Cub's NL East division title in 1989. In 1990, he



tied a major league record with three triples in one game with a 10-7 win over the Expos, driving in five runs.

He played for the San Francisco Giants in 1996, 2001, and 2002. He played in the World Series for the Giants in 2002 against the Anaheim Angels. In the sixth game of the World Series, he hit a home run. He retired after the 2002 World Series with a life time batting average of .276, 150 home runs, and 668 RBI's.

Shawon lives in Fremont with his wife and four children. He has three daughters aged 16, 15, and 9; and one son age 12. He is active in the community and does a lot of volunteering.

At our luncheon meeting Dunston will be talking about his career in baseball.



Next Optional out of town bowling tournament will be at Harvest Park, Brentwood October 18th and 20th.








