SPECIAL MEETING FOR ALL BRANCH MEMBERS


The State Board of SIR requests input and ideas from our Branch on solutions to several items. The State Broad has requested that we will have a special meeting to discuss the following items:

Our speaker for November is Nancy Farber, Chief Executive Officer of the Washington Township Health Care District, Fremont. She has been at Washington Hospital for twenty years in leadership roles. She was named the CEO in 1994.



Ms Farber received her Bachelor of Arts degree with Honors from Stanford University and received a

Masters in Public Health from the University of California, Los Angeles School of Public Health. Before coming to Washington Hospital, Ms Farber was the Assistant Administrator for four years at Hoag Hospital in Newport Beach, and previous to this position, she was the Assistant Administrator for Kaiser Foundation Hospital in Los Angeles.

Ms Farber has held numerous appointments and currently serves on the American Hospital Association Region 9 Board, as well as the AHA Task Force on Health Care Fragmentation. She was the "Woman of the Year on Health Care in 1999." In 2003, Ms Farber was named, "Woman of Distinction in Health Care and Wellness" by the East Bay Business Times. She was named "Citizen of the Year for 2003" by the Ohlone College Foundation. Her most recent honor was "2005 Good Scout Award" presented by the Mission Peak District, Boy Scouts of America.

Ms Farber and her husband, Peter Szekrenyi, have five children and reside in Sunol. She will speak on Washington Hospital's past, present, and future role in Fremont.






