Our Speaker – Jim Campbell by Little Sir Ted Bresler

Jim Campbell, a 77-year old retired newspaper product distribution worker, has been a self-taught pen-and-ink drawing artist nearly his entire life. Despite an accident at the age of 13 which



permanently disfigured the fingers of his drawing hand, he never lost his determination in his pursuit of art.

While he was working for the San Francisco Examiner as a young man, Jim spent his free time at Fisherman's Wharf drawing the colorful images he saw: teamsters, stevedores and marine life. Many persons who saw his art offered to purchase his works, and this introduced him to the world of commercial art.

Jim specializes in the drawing of sailing ships. He has drawn the all of historical ships of San Francisco Bay. In a career spanning over 55 years, Jim has created over 1,550 original works on a number of subjects.

Jim's artwork has made him an expert in the history of the seas from the 16th though early 18th centuries. He will speak on the eras of exploration and the Spanish Main and the Golden Age of Piracy. His information on the lives of the great pirates of history – Captain Kidd, Blackbeard, and Henry Morgan – and of explorer Sir Francis Drake – is fascinating.

Edited Excerpts of January 19th Minutes of Al Sprague



Big Sir Les Addison called the meeting to order at approximately 10:15 am.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, roll call showed two directors

absent: Don Gillis, and Bob Benya.

The Minutes of the November 2005 meeting were accepted.

Treasurer Report: Sir Louis Bufkin thanked Bobby Ben Snodgrass for the October report. The reports for November and December, including the Xmas Party expenses, were accepted. The ending cash balance on 12-31-05 was \$5002.25.

Little Sir Ted Bresler reported that a team would present the program for today's general meeting from Alameda County Water District, showing slides and presenting comments on their efforts to restore water service to a community devastated by Hurricane Katrina.

Audit: The report by the audit committee for 2005 (Sir Ben Fernandez, and Sir Vince Fernelius), concluding that the books were properly maintained, was accepted.

Big Sir comment: Our eight-page newsletter, The Pathfinder, is the best, according to regional and state officials. Thanks to Editor John Skarpelos.

Attendance: Sir Alan Douglass reported total membership is 265. Today's expected luncheon attendance is 206, including 5 speakers, and with 33 members excused. Membership: Sir Ed Bingle expects 6 new members.

Sports: Sir Nat Lord reported the following events are available: A's May 4, Giants June 21, Rivercats June 28, Warriors March 19.

Bowling: Sir Rollin Cunningham reported there are 15 regular bowlers to bowl in 60 award games coming up (none in January/February).

Birthdays: Sir Al Winkley reported that we have 22 birthdays for December and 15 for January; to celebrate today (ages 59 to 91).

Bridge: Sir Drag Dutina reported we have 4 groups.

Historian: Sir Peter Angelides reported that we had a "great year" in 2005.




WALT ODEN required a left knee replacement January 12. Walt missed his birthday luncheon to have the staples removed from his knee. Glad you are recovering OK, Walt.


