### Our Speaker – Douglas Treadway by Little Sir Ted Bresler

The immortal Yogi Berra once said, "If you come to a fork in the road, take it."

Twenty years ago Douglas Treadway came to a fork in the road in his career. Then a mid-level college administrator, he had to decide whether to seek a new career in private industry or to shoot for the presidency of a college. He chose the second path and has never been sorry.



Doug has been president of Ohlone College since July 2003. Since then he's come to 2 new forks in the road.

The first is the construction of the new Ohlone Campus in Newark. This will be the 1st community college in California to be completely designed using solar energy and geothermal heating and cooling. The campus, which will emphasize health, technology and other vocational programs, will be completed in 1-1/2 years and will open in January 2008 to 3,000 students.

The second is the development of the western and southern portions of the Fremont campus in Mission San Jose. Plans are now underway for a forward looking combination of commercial and housing in these areas.

Dr. Treadway has had a long career as a college professor, president and chancellor. He will tell us about his visionary approach to campus development in a stimulating message.


