TRAFFICKING IN THE NEWS

We often watch the TV news, but we seldom get an

opportunity to witness first hand how it is produced. I had this opportunity on May 3, when I went to KNTV, the NBC affiliate in San Jose, and got to watch news production and broadcasting in the making, meet a number of the personalities and learn about the amazing combination of technical and human skills that make today's TV news what it is.



One of these personalities in Mike Inouye, the weekday morning traffic anchor. How did he become an anchor? Well, as he says, he "fell into it". He first joined KNTV in 2001 as an internet reporter. He then served for 3 years at the station as an information technology technician, installing the very computer system he uses while broadcasting! His background as an improvisational comedian and his skills at live events led his colleague to encourage him to audition for the morning traffic slot when it opened up, and in 2005 he made the jump from behind the scenes to in front of the camera.

Mike, like the other TV anchors, produces his own material. His work space contains two computers which feed him information on the Bay Area traffic hotspots. The data he receives from the California Highway Patrol are derived from Caltrans road sensors. These show where traffic is moving smoothly and where it is bogged down. This information is interconnected with screens showing various segments of the Bay Area freeway system and the traffic movements on the roads. This is what you see in the background when Mike broadcasts his reports. You also see live feeds from remote cameras stationed in a number of Bay Area locations, along with mobile live feeds from the station's helicopter, which responds to traffic impacted areas with live on-the-spot coverage.

Mike is a vibrant, energetic young man who embraces his work with vigor and a strong sense of humor. He'll be with us on June 15 to tell us what it's like to be a TV news anchor. Don't miss it.

Treasurer's Report: Sir Louis Bufkin, referring to his Monthly Cash Report, dated April 1, 2006, reported a total cash balance of \$3,286.86 ; 265 active and 27 inactive members; attendance at the March meeting of 201 members (76%), 1 visitor, and 9 guests. The report was received and approved.

Attendance: Sir Alan Douglass reported the figures for today's general meeting: from the total of 266 members (45 excused), plus 9 guests and 1 speaker, there would be an estimated 215 persons for lunch.


