Our Speaker – Sir Bob Beam by Little Sir Ted Bresler



6:30 a.m. The LCI carrying a platoon of U.S. Army troops moved through choppy waters. Heavy German machine gun fire surrounded them. Then they landed on Utah Beach to start the daring expedition that led to the Allies' victory in Europe.

D-Day. June 6, 1944. And Sir Bob

Beam was there.

Bob Beam went to enlist in the Army on his 18th birthday in 1943. But it wasn't easy. He had no vision in his left eye. When he took the pre-induction physical he was first asked to cover his left eye and read with the right one. He did so. Then they asked him to cover his right eye and read with his left. Undaunted, he proceeded to cover his left eye with his other hand and read again with his good eye. This satisfied the Army, and Bob was inducted.

The war in the European Theater was tough. Bob was wounded twice in action. He is the holder of the Bronze Star and Purple Heart, as well as the Combat Infantry Badge.

After the war Bob attended UC Berkeley, where he received a B.A. in business administration. He also received his masters in Speech Communication from Cal State Hayward.

Bob became a vice-president of Morris Plan, a finance company. He later became the personnel director for Amfax, a subsidiary of Citicorp, and finally served the Social Security Administration as a special claims analyst.

Bob served his country with great patriotism, dedication and valor in World War II. He'll tell us all about it at our July meeting. You won't want to miss it.

Edited Excerpts of June 15th Minutes of Allen Sprague

Big Sir Les Addison called the meeting to order at 9:50 am and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call by the Secretary showed five officers and four directors present: Officers: Big Sir Les Addison, Little Sir Ted Bresler, Secretary Allen Sprague, Assistant Secretary Peter Angelides, Treasurer Lou Bufkin; Directors: Lloyd Anderson, Bob Benya, Howard Thompson, and Arthur Winkley. Absent: Assistant Treasurer Bobby Ben Snodgrass, and Directors Don Gillis and Bill Leake.

Minutes for the April 20, 2006 meeting, submitted by Secretary Allen Sprague, were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Sir Louis Bufkin, referring to his Monthly Cash Report for May 2006, dated June 1, 2006, and Sweetheart Luncheon report on expenses, ticket sales, and contributions, were approved. The Ending Cash Balance on June 1, 2006 was \$3,484.02.

Little Sir Ted Bresler reported that today's program speaker will be Mike Inouye, the traffic reporter for KNTV news.

Attendance: Sir Alan Douglas reported his expectations for today's meeting: From a membership total of 268, with 64 excused, plus 5 guests and one speaker, a projection of 205 persons will be present for lunch.

Membership: Sir Ed Bingle reported that of only three of five prospective members responded.

Birthdays: Sir Art Winkley reported that 23 members had birthdays in May, and 19 in June. Sir Ed Bingle at 90 is the most senior member expected to be present today.

Bowling: Sir Rollin Cunningham reported on Bowling Activities- See the bowling column on page 4 for details.

Social Committee: Big Sir Les Addison led a thunderous round of clapping for Tony Zeuli and his committee, for the outstanding Sweetheart luncheon in honor of our members who served our country in wars past.

Sports: Sir Nat Lord reported that tickets for the Giants game the next week had been distributed. The A's game last month attracted fewer than 300 Sirs.

Sunshine: Sir Dave Marymee reported there were 3 deaths in April-May. Jack Knoth has been moved to an assisted care facility.

Nominating Committee: The committee, consisting of Rob Ingebretson, Tom Sullivan, and Don Henry, Chair, made recommendations for the 2007 Candidates. The Slate of Candidates is shown on page 5. Big Sir Les Addison thanked Sir Don Henry for the committee's work.

Committee on Possible Relocation of Branch #59 Meeting Location: Sir Fred Gotthardt reviewed the background to this issue, and referred to a compilation of Pathfinder information, including a proposed ballot. (Other committee members: Bob Benya, Bill Briscoe, Drag Dutina, and Les Addison.) After considerable discussion on the prior surveys and questionnaires, a MOTION WAS PASSED: to submit a ballot to the entire membership to choose between Elks Lodge, Newark Pavilion, and Swiss Park; every active member shall be eligible to vote at the July meeting (those absent will receive a mail in ballot, in the July Pathfinder, to be postmarked by August 1st). Revisions to the ballot included in the Committee were approved to reflect this decision. The Ex Com will decide whether there is a clear mandate expressed by the results of the ballot. 


