Meals On Wheels - A Valuable Program

For many elderly persons in the Tri-City Area who have difficulty obtaining hot, nutritious, well balanced meals, the Meals on Wheels Program is a godsend.

Barbara Procter is the Coordinator of Volunteers for the Meals on Wheels program, one of the three programs of Life Elder Care.



She recruits volunteers to drive and bring the meals to the seniors and informs the public of the programs available. The meals are prepared in Livermore under the direction of a nutritionist. The program caters to diabetics, toothless persons, and those with stomach and swallowing problems. 23 volunteers, whose ages range from 16 ½ to 90, deliver the meals each day over assigned routes. The average volunteer delivers 6 to 25 meals daily in Fremont, Newark, and Union City. Total deliveries amount to 350 per day.

Ms. Procter started her working career as a 1st and 2nd grade teacher in New York and Boston, later teaching a cerebral palsy program. Sixteen years ago she moved to California and went into real estate. She loved the "people" part of real estate, but not the paperwork, so she made a career change and became the marketing and sales director at Carlton Plaza, a residential facility for seniors. This position developed her enjoyment with working with seniors, and led her to her present position with Meals on Wheels.

Edited Excerpts of August 17th Minutes of Allen Sprague

Big Sir **Les Addison** called the meeting to order at 10:15am, and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendance: Roll Call by the Secretary recorded the presence of 5 officers and 5 directors. Absent: Assistant Secretary **Peter Angelides** and Director **Howard Thompson**.

Minutes for the July 20, 2006 meeting were approved (and thanks given to Sir Howie Thompson for preparing in the absence of the Secretary).

Treasurer's Report: Sir **Louis Bufkin**, referring to his Monthly Cash Report for July 2006, and dated August 1, 2006, reported that the ending cash balance on August 1, 2006 was \$3,415.59.

Little Sir **Ted Bresler** reported that today's speakers will be two chiropractors.

Meeting attendance: Sir Alan Douglas reported the expectations for today: From a membership total of 271, with 53 excused, plus two guest speakers, about 190 will be present. Some discussion, but no decision, ensued about the possible need to bill unexcused absences, especially if a new caterer requires payment for all meals planned.

Membership: Sir **Ed Bingle** reported that one new member is planned to be inducted today.

Birthdays: Sir **Art Winkley** reported that 17 celebrants are expected today; the eldest at 94 (**Clarence Dutra**), and the youngest is 64 (**Aaron Wong**).

Bowling: Sir Rollin Cunningham reported on the activities of the bowlers (details of which will be in the next Pathfinder), including that Mowry Lanes has increased its fees to \$ 4.75 for 3 lines but practice is still \$1.00 per line. Branch 59 will be hosting a tournament at Mowry Lanes on October 1-2. Out of town tournaments coming up are in Vallejo, Dublin, Brentwood, Modesto, Concord, and San Rafael.

Pathfinder: Editor **John Skarpelos** announced that the deadline for the September Pathfinder edition is August 25th.

Golf: Sir **Bill Leake** reported that a detailed report would be in the Pathfinder. There is a State qualifier in Walnut Creek,

and the top two from each flight will go on to the State Championship. There will be a tournament in Solvang.

Sunshine: Sir **Dave Marymee** reported that Sir Oliver Knick got a ride to today's meeting. Sir Jack Webb does not have a special van and therefore he will be unable to attend. Sir Dave commented on and passed around a very fine pamphlet prepared for the memorial service at St. Joseph's for Sir **Jack Knoth**. He also complimented Editor **John Skarpelos** on the Knoth write up in the Pathfinder.

Cybergeezers: Sir Fred Gotthardt reported that next week's meeting will be on Wednesday, August 23rd, (rather than the usual Tuesday, because the Fukaya Room at the Library is not available).

Old business: Election results on the question whether to move the location of Branch 59 meetings. Sir Bob Benya, chair of the committee, thanked Sir John **Skarpelos** for the excellent analysis of the election results (printed in the August Pathfinder). A total of 205 ballots were cast out of which 99 members (48.3%) want to move to the Newark Pavilion, compared to 43 (21.0%) who want to move to the Elks Lodge, and 63 (30.7%) who preferred to remain at Swiss Park. After discussion of the results of the election, a MOTION was made and passed 6 yes and 2 no to: MOVE IN JANUARY 2007 TO NEWARK PAVILION. Discussion ensued over who would be the caterer (Newark Pavilion does not provide a caterer).

Whoever it is must be licensed to meet SIR standards. Big Sir Les Addison appointed Bob Benya and Fred Gotthardt to investigate and report back to Ex Com as to the available choices, and possibly bringing their preferred choice to be interviewed. The Secretary will maintain the ballots and tally sheets and Ex Com will consider further retention or destruction after Branch 59 is settled in at Newark Pavilion. It was the consensus of Ex Com that Big Sir Les Addison be the only authorized spokesperson regarding the issues.






