Our Speaker – Dr. Prasad Kilaru by Little Sir Ted Bresler

Hand Problems - And "Hands On" Solutions

Some of our speakers decided to seek their occupations or professions in their youth or adulthood. Dr. Prasad Kilaru, on the other hand, was born to become a physician and surgeon. It's a part of his family tradition.



His grandfather was the first person to be trained as a surgeon in his native Andhra Pradesh state in

India. His parents, aunt and uncle became doctors. So it is no wonder that he always wanted to be a surgeon.

Dr. Kilaru received his 2nd through 10th grade education in Boston, Massachusetts. Then he returned to India to attend medical school. He spent a 5-year surgical residency at Baystate Medical Center in Springfield, Massachusetts, working in plastic and hand surgery. This was followed by a 2-year plastic surgery residency at USC/LA County, then by a 1-year residency at USC Medical Center in Los Angeles.

After 2 years of practice in Los Angeles, he joined the Deccan Pacific Medical Group in Fremont 5 years ago, practicing hand, plastic and reconstructive surgery.

Dr. Kilaru treats generic hand problems, including hand and thumb arthritis, tumors, carpal tunnel, and infections. One of the more challenging of these is Dupuytren's (DOO-Pit-Rin's) disease, where the layer of flesh under the skin of the palm thickens and shrinks, resulting in a bending or curling of the fingers. Commonly found in older men of Northern European lineage, the disease used to require amputation of the fingers. Fortunately, modern medicine has advanced to provide for successful treatment through surgery and occupational therapy.

Dr. Kilaru will discuss the common hand diseases and their treatment at our October 19 meeting.

He is presently Chief of Surgery and the Wound Care Director at Washington Medical Center in Fremont.

Edited Excerpts of September 21st Minutes of Allen Sprague

Big Sir Les Addison called the meeting to order at 10:15am, and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call by Secretary: Officers present: Big Sir Les Addison; Little Sir Ted Bresler, Secretary Allen Sprague, Asst. Secretary Peter Angelides, Treasurer Louis Bufkin;

Asst. Treasurer Bobby Ben Snodgrass. Directors present: Lloyd Anderson, Don Gillis, Bill Leake, and Art Winkley. Absent: Directors Howard Thompson, and Bob Benya.

Treasurer's Report: Sir Louis Bufkin reported that as of September 9, 2006, the ending cash balance was \$3,543.40. Membership was 270 active and 26 inactive members. At the August 17th meeting, there were 184 members (68% of total), and 4 guests present. (Full details are in the Form 28 report)

Little Sir Ted Bresler reported that he has prepared a manual for his successor Sir Richard Holley. Today's speaker Barbara Proctor will be accompanied by two of her staff as additional guests.

Membership and Attendance: Sir Alan Douglass and Sir Ed Bingle reported that 194 members are expected today (64 excused), plus 5 guests. One new member is expected to be inducted.

Bowling: Sir Rollin Cunningham reported that Branch 59 had 29 bowlers at the Dublin tournament on September 18th, and that Branch 59 will host a tournament at Mowry Lanes on October 1st and 2nd (124 announcements have been mailed); singles at 10am and doubles at 1 pm. Other tournaments are coming up in October, November, and December. We now have 20 active bowlers.

Birthdays: Sir Art Winkley reported that 23 of 29 September celebrants are expected today: the most senior is Sir Tom Dehart at 90 years, and the youngest Sir Fred Ilg at 61.

Pathfinder: Editor Sir John Skarpelos announced that the deadline is next Friday, September 29th.

Cybergeezers: Sir Fred Gotthardt reported that the next meeting is Monday, September 25th at 2-4 pm. in the Fukaya A room (and not on the usual Tuesday).

Sunshine: Sir Dave Marymee reported on various members' illnesses and hospitalizations.

Big Sir Les Addison reported that the chairman and members of the Social Committee have resigned, effective December 31, 2006.

Old Business: Sir Fred Gotthardt noted that a prospective caterer for the Newark Pavilion was expected to be at today's board meeting, but failed to arrive. Big Sir appointed Sirs Bob Benya and Ted Bresler to contact the caterer to clarify questions remaining to be answered.

He is undergoing therapy and reports to Kaiser in October for further assessment of necessary treatment. We wish the best for Bob and hope for a speedy recovery.


