Our Speaker – Bill Marshak by Little Sir Ted Bresler

The Voice of Tri-City

You may have seen copies of the *Tri-City Voice* in your local library, bank, or business. Maybe you picked it up and read it.

I started some months ago and read it regularly, experiencing the high quality of this weekly local newspaper. Its editorials are well considered and written. It contains in-depth interviews with local officials and personalities you won't find



elsewhere. The advertisements are well laid out, with appealing color graphics.

Strangely enough, The Voice's publisher and editor-in-chief, Bill Marshak, was not educated or trained in journalism. Raised in Los Angeles, he was a pre-med student at Earlham College, a 1,000 enrollment school in Indiana. He spent a year in graduate studies in zoology at Cal State LA. Thereafter he taught math and science at inner city schools in Los Angeles, and later sold pharmaceuticals, insurance and securities.

After marrying his wife Sharon, at one time a production manager at the *Milpitas Post*, Bill moved to Fremont 10 years ago. Subscribing to 3 major metropolitan daily newspapers, he concluded that they provided no real local information to their southern East Bay readers.

Hoping to fill local readers' needs, Bill's first publishing effort was a calendar of events, which grew into a magazine, *What's Happening*, in September 1998. In January 2002 he started the then semi-monthly *Tri-City Voice*, which has been a weekly newspaper for the last 1-½ years.

After early financial difficulties in keeping the Voice afloat, Bill describes the present status of this venture as "very successful".

Bill Marshak envisions the *Tri-City Voice* as a positive community force. Learn more about his vision and success story at our November 16 meeting.

Edited Excerpts of October 19th Minutes of Allen Sprague

Big Sir Les Addison called the meeting to order at 10:15, and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call by Secretary: Officers present: Big Sir Les Addison, Little Sir Ted Bresler, Secretary Allen Sprague, Asst. Secretary Peter Angelides, Treasurer Louis Bufkin, Asst. for the December Holiday Party are available. Treasurer Bobby Ben Snodgrass. Directors present: Bill Leake, Howard Thompson, Bob Benya, and Art Winkley. Absent: Directors: Lloyd Anderson, and Don Gillis.

The Minutes for the September 21st meeting of Ex Com, incorporating corrections received by the Secretary, were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Sir Louis Bufkin reported that as of the end of September 2006 the cash balance was \$3,992.09.

Little Sir Ted Bresler reported that next month's speaker will be William Marshak, Publisher and Editor of the Tri-City Voice.

Membership: Sir Ed Bingle reported that as of 10/10/06 there are 268 active members and 24 inactive members.

Attendance: Sir Alan Douglas reported that for today's meeting 204 members, 3 guests, 1 visitor, and 1 speaker are expected, for a total of 209 (36 members are excused and 23 unexcused).

Bowling: Sir Rollin Cunningham reported on bowling activities and said this was his final report as Bowling Chairman, and thanked the Big Sirs who appointed him and all who assisted him in making Branch 59's bowling enjoyable. His assistant Sir Frank Cordova will be the new Bowling Chairman for Branch 59, and Sir Rollin expressed his confidence that Sir Frank will do an outstanding job.

Birthdays: Sir Art Winkley reported that 24 of 27 October celebrants are expected today's meeting. The most senior is Manuel Braga at 87 years, and the youngest is Terry Dalziel at 64.

Pathfinder Editor: Sir John Skarpelos announced that the copy deadline is next Friday, October 27th.

Cybergeezers: Sir Fred Gotthardt reported that the next meeting is the coming Tuesday, October 24th at 2-4 pm. in the Fukaya A Room.

Golf: Sir Bill Leake reported that the \$31 dues for 2007 are being collected and will be due no later than December 15th. There are three more events this year: Poppy Hills (October 31-November 1), Nuevo Vallarta (November), and a 12 day cruise with golf (December 1-12).

Sunshine: Sir Dave Marymee reported

on various members' illnesses and hospitalizations. Sir Dave told us that Branch 59 Sirs are healthy people: The sunshine report for November includes just 5 ailing men!

Social: Sir Tony Zeuli reported that tickets

Relocation of Place of Meeting: Sirs Bob Benya and Ted Bresler reported on contract negotiations with McDonough's Catering (Alameda), and the Newark Pavilion. The fee to use the Pavilion is \$250, including table set-up, and round tables would cost \$50 additional for a total of \$300 per meeting. Storage for SIR material is \$100 per year.

Ken McDonough, son of owner Peter McDonough, was present to answer questions from the Ex Com concerning price (\$9.00 + Sales Tax), table ware (silverware, paper napkins), menu (typical, e.g., chicken with gravy, rice/potato, salad, served in line), coffee (decaf & regular, possibly on each table), clean-up, table covering (plastic or cloth), condiments on table (salt and pepper), water pitchers, dessert selection (on a separate table). Bar would be available and staffed by Pavilion personnel. McDonough usually provides enough food to feed 10% more persons than Branch 59 estimates, insurance (commercial liability for 1 or 2 million, copy to be provided when the final contract signed), health standards (county health permit; but no City permit has been required by the Pavilion). A general sense of acceptability was expressed by Ex Com members.

Big Sir Les Addison stated that Officers Training will be on October 31st.




Raiders or 49ers may need him for linebacker. Teddy Bruski of the Patriots recovered from a stroke and is playing his linebacker position.






