Sir Allen Sprague January Meeting Minutes

Big Sir Richard Holley called the meeting to order at 10:25 and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call by Secretary: Officers present: Big Sir Richard Holley Little Sir Don Gillis, Secretary Allen Sprague, Assistant Secretary Peter Angelides, Treasurer Louis Bufkin, and Assistant Treasurer Bobby Ben Snodgrass. Officers absent: None. Directors present: Bob Anderson, Ted Bresler, Robert Ingebretson, and Roger Wallin. Directors absent: Bob Benya, and Bill Dark.

Treasurer's Report: Sir Louis Bufkin reported that as of December 4, 2007 the ending cash balance was \$4,741.90, and membership was 265 active members and 22 inactive members. At the November 15th luncheon there were 189 members (71% of total membership), 4 guests and no visitors present for a total attendance of 193. As of January 4, 2008 the ending cash balance was \$5490.87, and membership was 265 active members and 22 inactive members - this January 4th report reflects the receipts and expenses for the December 20th Holiday Luncheon at which there were 100 members (38% of total membership) and 124 quests present; there was a net surplus of \$109.87 (Full details are in the Form 28 reports on file, and the supplemental report of the details on the luncheon).

Program: Little Sir Don Gillis confirmed that today's speaker is Jess Strange, a community education advocate for legal assistance for seniors. The topic of her presentation is "Knowledge is Key: Know Your Medicare Rights."

Attendance: Sir Hugh Twomey reported that the expected attendance for today's luncheon is 201.

Membership: Sir Ron Brutvan placed James A. Doot, Jr., Tom P. Federico and Stan Peters up for membership. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve James A Doot, Jr., Tom P. Federico and Stan Peters as new members.

Birthdays: Sir Art Winkley reported that 23 members with December birthdays are expected today. The most senior celebrant is Sir Raymond Andrade at 93 and the youngest is George Perry at 63 (two others, celebrating 9 decades, are Glenn Hursey and Ed Myslewski). For January 16 celebrants are expected. The most senior is Stanley James at 86 and Paul Ruberto at 64.

Bowling: Sir Frank Cordova reported that upcoming events will be noticed in the next Pathfinder.

Golf: Sir Bill Leake reported that a full schedule for 2008 can be found at www. sirstategolf.com. The first tournament is Las Vegas in late March 2008. There will be 3 Reno trips this year. The Branch 59 golfers play Mondays and Thursdays at Sunol.

The Pathfinder and Roster: Editor John Skarpelos requested that the luncheon attendees be informed that new Branch 59 rosters will be available after the meeting.

Social Committee: Sir Doug Eads submitted a written report accounting for expenses and income; an earlier preliminary report of a \$31 returned check was discovered and replaced with another valid check (see also the Treasurer's Report). There was a net \$109.87 in income exceeding expenses. There were 100 members and 124 guests for a total of 224 in attendance.

Committee member Sir Allen Sprague commented that, although comments indicate attendees were pleased with the event, there was nevertheless only 31% of the total membership that came to the function. The committee was considering recommending to the Ex.Com. to consider sending a questionnaire to the membership to ascertain whether there are other format options for the two party meetings each year, with the objective of increasing membership participation. (One suggestion, from Sir Robert Ingebretson, was to ask the members if having both a regular meeting and a social event in December.

Sir Frank Campos reported that he had received a thank you addressed to all officers and members of Branch 59, from Edna Gamba on behalf of the Fremont Aires (which was the band providing the music), praising the entire luncheon event as superb (Edna also was ecstatic about Frank's singing—as we all are!).

Big Sir Richard Holley reported that he had received positive feedback as to the Holiday Luncheon meal and entertainment, but there should be better and bigger Bloody Marys, and the beer ran out! However, he noted that the sole bartender is a volunteer!

Bridge: Sir Drag Dutina requested that he announce to the lunch attendees that a brief meeting would be held after the luncheon speaker, to discuss possible interest in joining a Branch 59 bridge team.

Sunshine: Sir Dave Marymee reported that Nebraska is a good State to be from. He followed this announcement with reports on the status of illnesses and recovery of several Branch 59 members. A more up-to-date report will be reported in the next Pathfinder.

Cybergeezers: Sir Fred Gotthardt reported the Cybergeezers will meet next Tuesday January 29th at 2pm, in the Fukaya Room A at the Fremont Main Library. This is the 4th Tuesday of the month instead of the usual 3rd Tuesday.

Big Sir Richard Holley adjourned the meeting at 10:55 am.




VERN TALLEY missed the January luncheon as he had heart valve and blood circulation problems- We hope Vern's health improves.
