#### **Sir Allen Sprague March Meeting Minutes**

Big Sir Richard Holley called the meeting to order at 10:20 a.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call by Secretary: Officers present: Big Sir Richard Holley Little Sir Don Gillis, Secretary Allen Sprague, Assistant Secretary Peter Angelides, Assistant Treasurer Bobby Ben Snodgrass. Officers absent: Treasurer Louis Bufkin. Directors present: Bill Anderson, Ted Bresler, Bill Dark, and Roger Wallin. Directors absent: Bob Benya and. Robert Ingebretson.

The Minutes for the February 21, 2008 meeting of the Ex. Com. were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Assistant Treasurer reported that as of March 7, 2008 the ending cash balance was \$2,595.04, and membership was 264 active members and 21 inactive members. At the February 21st luncheon there were 216 members (82% of total membership), 2 guests and 1 visitor present for a total attendance of 219 (Full details are in the Form 28 report on file.)

Program: Little Sir Don Gillis confirmed that today's speaker is Alan W. Weiner, an engineer, scientist, and hypnotherapist, who will talk about his book "Just Before the Giggle, A Journey from Suffering to Freedom."

Attendance: Sir Hugh Twomey reported that the expected attendance for today's luncheon is 197.

Membership: Sir Ron Brutvan placed James W. Ploor (sponsored by Richard Holley), and John M Pesek III (sponsored by Jerry Sabo) up for membership. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve James W. Ploor and John M Pesek III as new members. Sir Ron also reported on the change of status: One member, Robert J McGrath, who was inactive, has become active. Big Sir Richard said we love and need new members (we have 266 of the 325 authorized).

Birthdays: Sir Art Winkley reported that 21 March nativities are expected, with birth years from 1921 through 1940, ages 68-87. The most senior celebrant is Bruno Orsetti at 87, closely followed by 86ers Paul Lanferman and John Austin, and the youngest David Tanner at 68.


