Acting Assistant Secretary Drag Dutina raised the question of whether there was a quorum present since only half the voting members were in attendance. A quorum was declared to be present by virtue of the presence of Sir Drag Dutina as Acting Assistant Secretary.

The Minutes for the April 17, 2008 meeting of the Ex. Com. were approved.

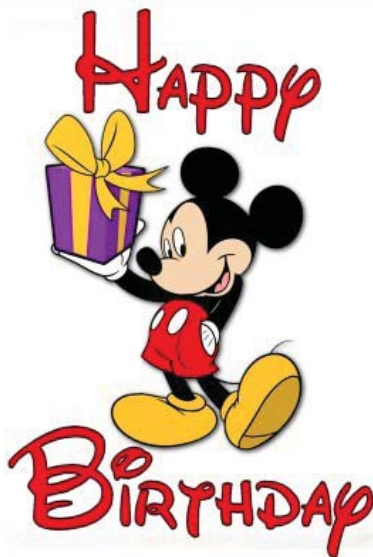

**FRED CUTTER** was hospitalized June 19 because of abdominal pain. Fred came home June 21. With medication, Fred says he is feeling better.

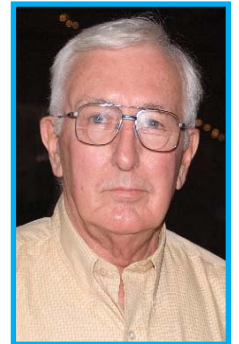
**CHARLES DUNCAN** says he is fully recovered from a bout with pneumonia. Charles enjoyed the June luncheon.
