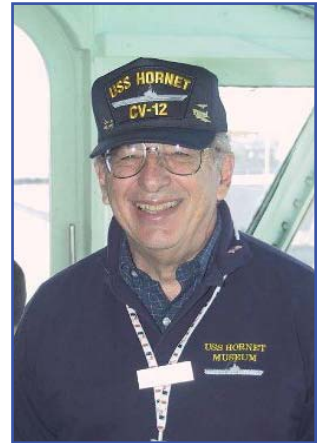

Our Speaker Tom Federico by Little Sir Don Gillis

Tom Federico completed the Navy's Flight Training program in 1956 and was assigned to Attack Squadron 155 flying AD Skyraiders from the aircraft carriers USS Hornet and USS Hancock. He left the Navy in 1963 and was employed by Ameron International's Pipe Division, a manufacturer of



large diameter concrete and steel pipe. He held various positions for Ameron, the last being the Northern Division's Sales Manager. Since 1997 he has volunteered as a Docent, conducting tours on the USS Potomac and the USS Hornet.

His talk will cover the 8 ships named Hornet that served our country, with emphasis on the last two that were aircraft carriers. The carrier that is



docked at Alameda, CVS-12, served our country from 1943 to 1970, all through WW 2, the Cold War, Vietnam, and the Space Program.

Sir Allen Sprague August Meeting Minutes

Big Sir Richard Holley called the meeting to order at 10:14 AM and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call by Secretary: Officers present: Big Sir Richard Holley, Little Sir Don Gillis, Treasurer Sir Louis Bufkin, Assistant Treasurer Sir Bobby Ben Snodgrass. Officers absent: None. Directors present: Sir Bill Anderson, Sir Ted Bresler, Sir Bill Dark and Sir Roger Wallin. Directors absent: Sir Bob Benya, and Sir Robert Ingebretson.

The Minutes for the July 17, 2008 meeting of the Ex. Com. were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Sir Louis Bufkin reported that the ending balance on August 4, 2008 was \$2,818.56. There were 266 active and 21 inactive members. Luncheon attendance was 189 members (71%), and 7 guests for a total of 196. (Full details are in the Form 28 report on file.)

Attendance: Sir Hugh Twomey reported that the expected attendance for today's luncheon is 191.

Program: Little Sir Don Gillis reported that today's speaker David Morse (NASA) will be presenting his report on the future of our space program without slides (we are still researching acquisition of a screen and projector adequate for our meetings).

Birthdays: Sir Art Winkley reported that our eldest birthday boy Sir Clarence Dutra (96) was uncertain about making the meeting. Expected to attend are 19 August celebrants with birthdays ranging from 62 (Sir Douglas Howd) to 92 (Sir John O'Connor), with natiivities from 1916 to 1946, and including notables Sir Tom Sherba, and Sir Arnold George. 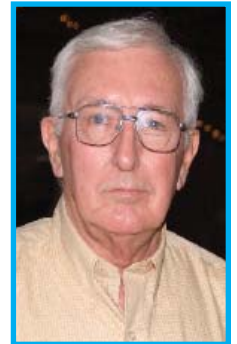
THOMAS TINKER missed the August luncheon as he had a medical appointment. Thomas attended the July luncheon using a walker.

JACK WEBB says he missed the August luncheon as he did not have reservation for pickup by Fremont Para transit. Jack missed his Virgin Mary cocktail.

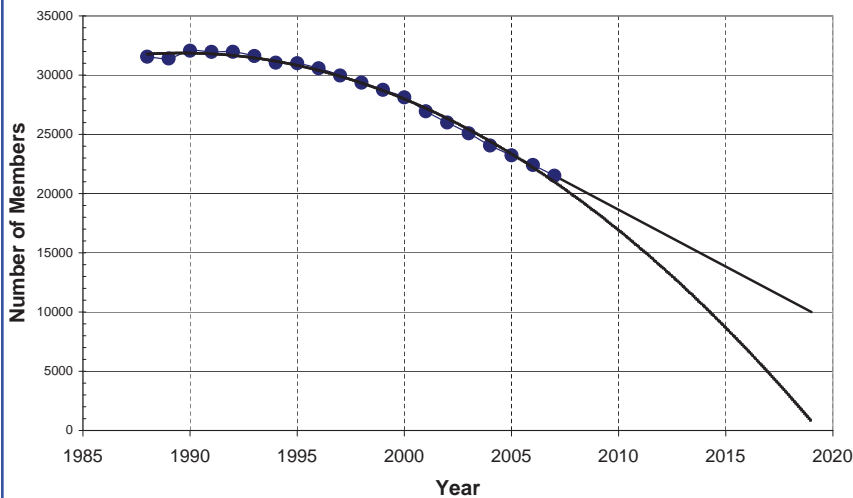

SIR Total Membership by Year



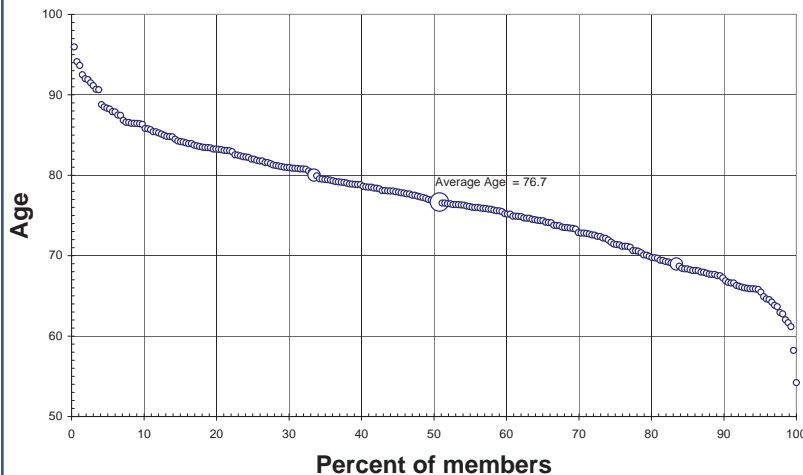
Does SIR Have a Future?

If we remain complacent, Sons In Retirement may become extinct in the next decade. In the top chart we have plotted the total membership of SIR over the period 1988-2007. Depending upon how we extrapolate this data we might predict that SIR will not be around in 10 years. In the lower chart Branch 59 age distribution is displayed. The average age of Branch 59 is 76.7.

Recent studies made by Sir Jim Stedman, our Region 6 director for the year 2009, show that a typical branch grows rapidly in its first five years, flat membership for a number of years, and then decline.

Each year the average age of a branch will increase by one year unless new members are brought in to compensate for losses. New members need to be recruited in sufficient numbers to prevent any further increase in branch average age and membership losses. Stedman reported that in his branch they had to induct members at the rate of 12% annually in order to

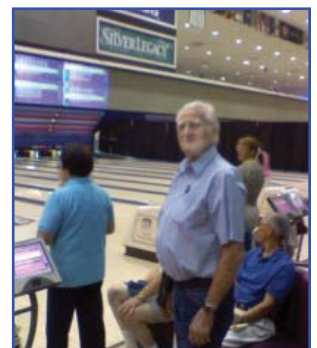

stop the increase in branch average age and membership loss.

Stedman suggests that branch leaders need to eagerly recruit and accommodate new members, to allow and promote branch growth. They should be willing to solve all problems that may arise as a result of branch growth.
