We owe our thanks to Richard Holley for his service to our organization. He is always upbeat and fun to be around. We have almost all new officers this year and we are dedicated to giving our best to SIR. We hope to add some activities that will get more members involved. You will be hearing more about this next

An old problem has reared its ugly head. We have an increasingly more serious problem with seats being reserved for Sirs who do not attend. The most recent incident was at the November meeting. A Sir, who joined in 2008, told me that he had spent the entire "social" time trying to find a seat. All were reserved. I made a PA announcement for all to be seated, and raise hands if seats were available. No one responded. I found an empty seat at a table in front for him. He said that he was about to ask for a refund and leave. I observed that there were a number of unoccupied seats when the lunch began. Last summer, many seats were reserved for Sirs who were out of town for a golf tournament, and there were many members searching for a place to sit.

The solution to the problem is very simple. **DO NOT RESERVE A SEAT UNLESS YOU HAVE BEEN NOTIFIED THAT THE SIR WILL BE AT THE LUNCHEON.** Do not assume that they will be there. You must have either received an e-mail or a telephone call before reserving a place. If this is followed, we will not have a problem.

It is an honor to serve as Big Sir, and I am looking forward to the coming year.

## Our Speaker Susi Cherry by Little Sir Frank R. Thomas

Susi Cherry, a native Californian, retired interior designer, has volunteered for Guide Dogs for the Blind for over 20 years. Having raised five puppies for Guide Dogs for the Blind, currently Susi is a Breeder Custodian for two Labrador Retrievers, Westie and Globie (see photo).

She volunteers as a docent, giving tours on the San Rafael campus, chairs the Procurement

Committee for Guide Dogs for the Blind's largest fundraiser, Napa Valley Gala and participates on the Speakers Bureau of Guide Dogs for the Blind.

Blindness affects 3.3 million Americans, according to the National Eye Institute; the National Federation of the Blind estimates an additional 50,000 people will become blind each year. Since 1942, the San Rafael organization has matched more than 11,000 guide dogs in the United States and Canada. It also pays all student expenses as well as round-trip travel to its California and Oregon campuses.

Guide Dogs for the Blind is a national nonprofit organization based in San Rafael, Calif. Its services are provided free-of-charge to those it serves, and relies solely on private donations (GDB receives no government funding). ## Sir Allen Sprague November Meeting Minutes

The Secretary announced that 100% of the board members were present.

The Minutes for the October 16, 2008 meeting of the BEC were approved. Big Sir Richard and Secretary Sir Allen thanked Sir Jim Ferenz, Secretary Elect, for doing the minutes, in the absence of Secretary Sir Allen.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Sir Louis Bufkin reported that as of November 5, 2008, the beginning cash balance was \$3,029.87, and the ending balance was \$4,847.73. There were 258 active and 27 inactive members. Luncheon attendance was 194 members (75%), 1 visitor and 8 guests for a total of 203. (Full details are in the Form 28 report on file.)

Program: Little Sir Don Gillis confirmed that today's speaker is F.B.I. Special Agent Michael Gimbel who will present "The FBI and Counterterrorism."

Membership: Sir Ron Brutvan recommended and BEC moved, seconded, and passed a motion to approve three new members: Edward "Ed" Blank, Placido E. Hernandez, and Dale V. Murray; and membership for two returning former members Sir Leo J. Hinkel, and Sir William J. Wilson. Sir Ron also reported the resignation of Sir Art Lampert.

Cybergeezers: Sir Fred Gotthardt reported that the next session will be next Tuesday November 25th at 2pm, in the Fukaya Room A at the Fremont Main Library.

The Fremont Tappers will again be the star attraction for our entertainment. Sir Gordon emphasized the need for more quality donations for the drawing, such as restaurant passes. Big Sir Richard stated he would today urge the members to make gift donations.

Sunshine: Sir Dave Marymee reported on the health status of several Sirs and their spouses, including Sir Frank D. Thomas' wife Virginia who is ill; Sir Frank Campos, now using a walker, who hopes he and wife Betty will come to the Xmas Party.
