Our Speaker David Kiehn by Little Sir Frank R. Thomas

David Kiehn is a founding member, historian and film programmer for the Niles Essanay Silent Film Museum, a non-profit organization founded in 2001 in Fremont. He is also the author of Broncho Billy and the Essanay Film Company, the definitive history of that pioneering film company,



published in 2003 after seven years of intensive research. Before his work on the book, he was a motion picture camera technician for twenty years at several rental houses supplying movie equipment for production companies and independent filmmakers in the San Francisco Bay Area.

The Essanay Film Company studios located in Niles produced almost 1000 films during its short life from 1912 to 1916. The Niles Museum came into being in 2001 after several of the founding members had produced the annual Broncho Billy Silent Film Festival beginning in 1998 under Niles Main Street Association sponsorship. The museum found a home in 2004 when the Edison Theater became available to lease after being a photography studio for 15 years. In January 2005 the museum started its Saturday Night at the Movies series, silent films every Saturday night with live musical accompaniment. In the four years it has now been in operation over 800 silent films were shown, and audiences continue to come and enjoy this unique form of entertainment in an authentic nickelodeon theater setting.


