the decision to reschedule the event to June 18th.

We notified our membership by email, and by telephone, and set about to find a replacement caterer. We found one, and if we are satisfied with the June luncheon, we will use that company for subsequent months.

In late May and early June, we emailed the membership that there would not be a regular June meeting, and asked them to let us know if they planned to attend the Sweetheart Luncheon rescheduled for that date. Those without email were notified by telephone. This was a lot of work for all who were involved, and we hope that we were successful in reaching everyone.

We were able to bring about some significant changes in the Pavilion Bar. Now we will be able to bring in our own wine for the Sweetheart Luncheon, and for the Christmas Party, and we will not be charged a fee for removing the corks. In addition, larger plastic glasses will be used from now on for cocktails, and wine. (The health department will not allow real glasses to be used because the bar does not have a dishwasher.) These improvements should satisfy most of our complaints.

We owe our Social Committee our thanks for all their hard work in putting together the Sweetheart Luncheon. The circumstances were extraordinarily difficult but I'm sure the event will be enjoyable and memorable.



Raymond arrived home to stay May 9th. Raymond says he is doing well.


JACK GAUNT has recovered from heart bypass surgery. Jack was planning to attend the May luncheon and join the SIR Singing Group and participate in the group's presentation.




