Her publications include major contributions to the fourth edition of Computer and Web Resources for People with Disabilities, as well as articles in MacUser, Communications Disorders Quarterly, JASIS, Library Hi Tech News, and many conference presentations. She holds a Masters degree in Library Science from the University of Michigan.

We do this so children with disabilities can succeed in school, adults with disabilities can find (and keep) jobs and everyone can use the internet, email and benefit from the digital revolution. 
