Our Speaker Bob Benya by Little Sir Frank R. Thomas

Bob Benya, our September speaker, has been a member of SIR Branch 59 since October 2000. He was born in Yonkers, NY on March 19, 1931, the eleventh child of Michael and Susan Benya, immigrants from Czechoslovakia.

He was raised in New York and graduated from Syracuse



University in 1953 with a business degree. ROTC involvement at Syracuse led him to become a military pilot in the U.S. Air Force. He trained at various locations for three years. After graduating, he came to Travis Air Force Base in California during the Korean War. After leaving the Air Force in 1959 he refused to leave California so Bob attended Hastings College of the Law graduating in 1961. He practiced law in Fremont for 37 years and retired in 1998. He has represented many members of Branch 59.

He declines to speak about Aviation or the Law but proposes to tell us all he knows about Mission San Jose in the City of Fremont. He has been a docent at the Mission for several years and has encountered numerous precocious fourth graders during that time. Our speaker loves history and he will share Mission history with us along with the comments of some of the students along the way. The Mission is visited by ten thousand 4th grade students every year.

Mission San Jose was founded in 1797. It is two hundred and twelve years old at this time. The Mission museum is the oldest building in Alameda County.




