Thomas Blalock was first elected to the Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) Board in 1994. Since then, voters re-elected him in 1998, 2002 and 2006 to represent Fremont, Newark, Union City and portions of Hayward. He has served as Vice President and President of the Board.



Blalock is dedicated to expand

BART south. He serves on the Silicon Valley Rapid Transit Project Policy Advisory Board, whose efforts include the new Warm Springs Station and the future BART extension to Santa Clara County.

Director Blalock brings to the BART Board an extensive background in planning, engineering and administration. His professional career spans 43 years working for three cities (Mountain View, Sunnyvale and Fremont). From 1984 to 1994 he served on various policy committees for the League of California Cities and served as President (1991) for the League's Public Works Officers Department. He retired in August 1995.

He holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering from San Jose State University and is a licensed Civil Engineer.

Blalock's community involvement includes being a parent faculty club board member at the Chadbourne School and Mission San Jose High School. He is a member of the Fremont Kiwanis Club and the Fremont Chamber of Commerce. In 1996 he chaired the City of Fremont's Downtown Planning Advisory Committee.

Director Blalock resides in Fremont with his wife, Gail. They have five children, three grandsons and five granddaughters. His hobbies include wine making, fishing, boating and travel.

He will inform us on the status of BART and its future plans to expand.



Strikes and Spares by Jerry Sabo



At our first tournament of the year, January 19th in Stockton, **Jerry Sabo** and **Don Henry** did well. Unfortunately they were not teamed up as doubles partners, but still should place in both singles and all events. Next on the agenda is Napa Bowl in Sonoma (Napa actually), February 1st and 3rd, and Granada Bowl in Livermore for

February 17th. Our March tournaments include Petaluma on March 8 or 10 and Concord on March 15, or 17. We will probably go to the Monday dates, but who knows.

When we go to a tournament it is usually a day long affair. Nat Lord prefers breakfast at the Denny's on Mowry, but we often stop at the Waffle House in Livermore, or another breakfast house on the way to our journey. The day is a social event usually beginning with free coffee and donuts followed by the pledge to the flag and a drawing for a house prize, wine, or even \$\$\$. We most always begin at 10 A.M. by bowling singles. Most houses furnish a great lunch special and Modesto even includes a free lunch with bowling. The group from Fremont along with some Branch 6 bowlers usually brings the largest contingency of bowlers, and overall I think we win accordingly. Once lunch is over we bowl doubles. This simply means that both you and your partner's scores are combined for a doubles series. Finally, the series from singles and from doubles are totaled to give an all events score. Some of the tournaments such as the one at the National Bowling Center in Reno have team events too. That just means that a team of four bowlers get a combined series.

Everyone has a good chance at a tournament because we bowl with 100% handicap. For example, if the top bowler at the tournament average 220 per game and my average is 150, then for each game that I bowl there is 70 pins added to each game. If I happen to bowl a game of 200 then my handicap game is 270 and if my other two games are good I should win some money. Similarly, if a bowler has an average of 100, and bowls a 150 game then his handicap would be a 270 also.

We were saddened by the loss of SIR bowler and friend, **Harry Edwards.** Harry happened to be one of my administrators back at the old Newark High (now Newark Memorial High). On a more positive note we welcome back Sir **Ray Erickson.** Ray hasn't bowled with us for a year, but I suspect that he will be in good form and ready for a tournament in Carson City this April – hope so.




