Our Speaker David Smith by Little Sir Hugh Twomey

Our speaker, David Smith, is Mayor of the City of Newark and Executive Director of the Ohlone College Foundation.

Mr. Smith will be speaking to Branch 59 to share information about the facility needs at the Ohlone College Fremont campus. Ohlone has been a valuable community



member since 1965 and has provided important education opportunities to over 300,000 citizens of this area. Every semester almost 20,000 students take classes on our two campuses. It is important to the College to continue to offer the classes needed to prepare students for the University or for the work force in facilities that match today's needs.

The campus was built in 1974, with a main Quad surrounded by nine original buildings, known as the Academic Village. The majority of Ohlone's classrooms, laboratories and other academic facilities are still located in these buildings. However, very little has been done to upgrade the facilities since they were first constructed. This means that many of our academic facilities are out of date, are not up to current safety and accessibility standards, and no longer meet the needs of today's students and modern curriculum.

Ohlone has just completed construction of two new facilities using money from Bond Measure A, which was passed by voters in 2002. The Ohlone College Newark campus and the new Student Services Building on the Fremont campus are stellar examples of what modern academic facilities should look like and how they should operate. Unfortunately, by comparison, the two new facilities point out the deficiencies of the rest of the campus.

Surveys show that the public highly values Ohlone's role in the community and supports the idea of a bond to address the needs for facility improvements.




BRIDGE GROUPS

SUNSHINE REPORT




