

Our Speaker James Stanhope by Little Sir Ron Holladay

Jim Stanhope says his life really began in Niles Grammar School when he became aware of a beautiful classmate – Juanita Galvin! His graduation from Washington High School in 1941 and the good life was soon interrupted by the attack on Pearl Harbor. His 1942 enlistment in the Army Air Corps produced a newly minted 2nd Lt. P-40 fighter pilot in March 1944. By October



1944 he arrived in Italy and was assigned to the 14th P-38 Fighter Group. The following nine months were spent driving a P-38 over the Alps into Germany, escorting large bomber groups. There were also assorted dive bombing and ground attack missions on German rail and other targets.

Some 200 combat hours later the war ended, then home to California and marriage to the waiting Juanita. In 1947 he was recalled to the new USAF and a career in military aviation. Although always a fighter pilot, an early specialization in (atomic) weapons employed on various fighter plane generations, made for a busy life during the cold war period. In 1952, he had a stint in Korea, then a tour of duty at the RAF base in Alconbury, UK. He was then assigned to Headquarters Air Force at the Pentagon. Four years later he was sent to diplomatic duty as an Advisor to the Peruvian Air Force in Lima Peru.

Since retiring from the Air Force, Jim has held various civilian positions: Vice President of a Regional Airline, President and CEO of a Commuter Airline, CEO of an Aircraft Maintenance Company.

Jim will captivate Branch 59 relating his adventures in Europe during World War II.

Treasurer's Report: Sir Ben
Fernandez reports financials in good
condition but continues to caution that
we are not growing our revenue. A long
discussion on the issues was conducted
and the board agreed that we would
look at the financials in detail at the six
month point in the year and continue to
be watchful on a month to month basis.

Little Sir's Report: Sir Ron Holliday reported that our speaker will be Mr. Jack Swenson who is an author and will speak to us on writing in general and specifically on writing life stories. Sir Ron also reminds the group to be on the lookout for good speakers.

The answers are not as simple as recruit new members and we need to get to the true solution of the problem. Sir Don Graff, our Area Governor, stated that this is a problem across all Branches. He further states the nature of retirement is changing in that more people are working on a part time basis. We need to find ways to attract the younger retirees.

A proposal was made to eliminate the fee for Guest Lunches in order to motivate people to bring guests for possible membership. A motion was made and seconded. Discussion was tabled to the June meeting.

Old Business:

Sir Frank R. Thomas is continuing to look into where best to advertise our Branch to help in the recruiting process.



SUNSHINE REPORT



LYNN PURVIS lost his wife Marlene, who died May 20, age 74. We at SIR wish to express our sympathy to Lynn and his family.


CARL SHANER (Sunshine Committee) takes shots in his lower spine to alleviate pain. We wish him well.
