

# Our Speaker Dave Dockter by Little Sir Ron Holladay

Our speaker for July, Dave Dockter, happens to be the son of one or our members. He is the son of Alvin Dockter. Dave is the Environmental Planner Managing Arborist for the City of Palo Alto, CA. His presentation will open your eyes to the beauty and diversity of trees in our area. It may remind you of childhood experiences, hikes in the hills and understanding the



technical aspects of trees. Learn the responsibilities of the suburban forest we live in and how to maintain it.

His presentation will take you through a tour of some of the most fun highlights, facts and lies about famous and historical significant trees in northern California. A pictorial of over 100 years of tree maintenance of El Palo Alto redwood. The goal of the talk is to simply heighten your awareness and appreciation of some of the elements that define our character, our urban forest shade canopy, and how to sustain its benefits. These are amazing trees in our natural and built environment, and you will never see them the same again.

Mr. Dockter is involved in many Arborist Organizations in the bay area, has been involved in amending several municipal tree ordinances throughout California and is involved with creative enforcement remedies to effect compliance. He is involved with the El Camino Real Pilot Design Workshop, Architectural Review Board advisory, High Speed Rail PA Task Force and principal author of the Palo Alto Tree Technical Manual.

# Letters to the Editor

Hi John:

I wanted to respond to your Pathfinder invitation to proffer thoughts as to the SIR falling attendance. I think it is probably pretty well known that cultural shifts have occurred which transcend all service and social organizations. You can talk to any Elk, Rotarian, Lion club member and they will all attest to a decrease in attendance. The next in line generation is simply not of the joiner mindset. When I joined the Fremont Rotary in 1985, it had 106 members... it now has 46. It is not the bar – nor the food, necessarily, since that is just a microcosm of any overall bigger problem. The cost might have something to do with it. When I joined the sirs almost 12 yrs ago, the cost of the meal was 8.00. Now it is 17. For people on fixed incomes, I am sure the rising costs have something to do with it. I think it will require a seismic shift in how the SIRs approach the problem. Maybe go to a less expensive meal, such as breakfast instead of lunch, a change in venue to a less expensive meeting place.

When I was in Solvang last year for the golf tournament, I sat next to the incoming president of SIR. I told him that maybe SIR should utilize its existing membership to emphasize leaving portions of estates to the SIR to help subsidize the food costs. I was told in no uncertain terms that the charter would not allow that. Well, maybe the charter needs to be changed then. I told him I would be willing to leave I00K from my estate to the SIR to help lessen the future costs to its members... I was told that would require more than SIR could handle administratively since, after all, it is a volunteer work force and the additional work would prove unwieldy.

Such negativism! No wonder the SIRs are in trouble. With that kind of static don't change anything attitude, I can only see long term failure in the organization.
