

Our Speaker Rick Pickering by Little Sir Ron Holladay

Have you been to the Alameda County Fair? Have you every thought about how it is organized and executed? Our guest speaker this month is Rick Pickering, who is the director of our county fair. His talk today will focus on the fair and its operation. Just think about the activities that take place during the fair and how many events take place. Mr. Pickering will describe how much planning is involved



and how many people are planning its execution.

The Alameda County Fair has been named one of the Top 50 Fairs in the Nation. The Fair has been the most awarded fair facility in the western United States for the past five years and has garnered eight international Awards.

As C.E.O. of Alameda County Agricultural Fair Association, Mr. Pickering is heading a self-sustaining nonprofit corporation which manages the 268 acres of Fairgrounds and the "Oldest One Mile Track in America." Mr. Pickering has previously served as the Deputy General Manager for the Orange County Fairgrounds, Costa Mesa, CA.

Prior to his work in County Fairs, Mr. Pickering spent twelve years in City Management.

Mr. Pickering holds a Bachelor's degree from Biola Univ., La Mirada CA. and a Master's degree from USC. He serves as a director on many West Coast Fair and Festival industry such as 'Western Fairs Association,' 'California Fair Services Authority,' 'California Authority of Racing Fairs,' 'California Construction Authority,' And 'California Fairs Alliance.'





Dear Editor

It doesn't take a rocket scientist to figure out that changing demographics is the primary cause of SIR's declining membership in the Tri-City area. One only needs to look around at the monthly luncheons to realize the vast majority of members are Caucasian and Hispanic. Most of our friends and neighbors have already been recruited into SIR, and as we get older, our circle of friends diminish as retirees die or move out of the area.

Many Tri-City neighborhoods have morphed from Caucasian to predominately Indo Asian, Chinese, and Arab. While they are polite, my experience is most of them choose not to assimilate, but rather they prefer to keep to themselves, predominately associating only with friends and neighbors of their same ethnicity. While diversity is what made this country great, unless we figure out how to more effectively associate with our newer neighbors, SIR Area 59 will continue to decline in membership. For example, I do not believe folks of Hindu or Muslim religions would be willing to participate in SIR meetings that always open by citing "Under God" in our Pledge of Allegiance.

I also believe it was a mistake to move our luncheons from Swiss Park to the Newark Pavilion. Now we don't even have a bar, and the food is catered rather than prepared on site. Bringing in our own

alcoholic beverage is a ridiculous situation for a social organization. Additionally the food was much better at Swiss Park and, even though it has its shortfalls, it provided a more intimate social environment. The good news is, as SIR Branch 59 continues to decline in membership, it would make a lot of sense, both economically and socially, to move back to Swiss Park.
