Our Speaker George Vlastelica by Little Sir Skip Mugford

Long time educator and community volunteer George Vlastelica will be the speaker for the July luncheon meeting. George grew up in Washington State and graduated from Western Washington University. He did graduate work at U.C. Berkeley and San Jose State.



He will discuss the Selective Service System and the Korean War and how it changed the lives

of so many people. George was drafted into the Army in 1951 and did 16 weeks of basic training at Camp Roberts. He was trained in all heavy weapons available to the infantry. After arriving in South Korea he was assigned to a heavy weapons company. The war was raging and the United Nations forces were not doing very well. China entered the war in the fall of 1950 and turned the tide even more. We were short on supplies and struggled until more countries sent troops. Eventually we won a few battles but paid a huge price in bodies. While the war was going on the American people had little knowledge of the terrible price being paid. After 37 months, an Armistice was signed. Both North and South Korea were totally destroyed and millions of lives were lost. North Korea is still a problem today.

George was wounded in battle and spent 90 days in a M.A.S.H. hospital where he was treated by Dr. Sammie Lee, the I948 Olympic Diving Champion. They had a great time together.


Winkley Awarded Honorary Life Membership
