Speaker Brian Ancona by Sir Sheldon Schwartz

Detective Brian Ancona was hired in 1984 by the Fremont Police Department as a Police Tech Trainee and was assigned to the Jail. He worked 2½ years in the jail before becoming a police officer. His assignments have been Patrol, School Resource Officer, and Detective as of 2002. He was then assigned to the General Assignment Unit as a Burglary Detective investigating commercial,



residential, and auto burglaries. One year into this assignment he was asked to take a position with a Federal task force referred to as R.E.A.C.T or Rapid Enforcement Allied Computer Team. His primary assignment with R.E.A.C.T was to investigate Identity Theft. This assignment lasted one year before being called back to Fremont Police Department to take a position as a Financial Crimes Investigator.

In July 2005 Brian became the Semi-Permanent Fraud Investigator for the Fremont Police Department. Through training and experience he has been recognized as an Identity Theft Investigation Specialist. As an added assignment he has been assigned to a task force with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) to investigate money laundering.

The purpose of his presentation to Sons In Retirement is to inform the members of a variety of Fraud. Fraud such as Lottery and Sweepstakes scams, Internet scams, home repair scams and several others scams of interest to the retired community.








SUNSHINE REPORT
