#### **MEETING MINUTES**

A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the February Minutes as published in the pathfinder.

#### **OFFICERS REPORTS**

#### **Secretary**

Sir James Ferenz reported that our yearly Officers Liability Coverage statement needed to be made to wit:

Pursuant to the provisions of California Corporations Code 5239, effective January 1, 2002, Branch 59 has received a determination made by the SIR State Insurance Committee which reveals that the cost of obtaining Officer and Directors Liability insurance exceeds 5% of the prior year budget. This constitutes a good faith effort to obtain such insurance and we therefore defer to the Sections 5239 which states" there shall be no personal liability to a third party for monetary damages on the part of a volunteer director or volunteer executive officer of a nonprofit corporation subject to this part, caused by the director's or officer's negligent act or omission in the performance of that person's duties as a director or officer." Therefore it is moved, seconded and passed that Branch59 cannot afford to purchase this type of liability insurance and the Branch elects to be covered by the provision of Section 5239. Treasurer's Report

Sir Hugh Twomey reported that we could lose \$727.00 in the year if anticipated spending and income remain as forecasted. This continues to send up a warning that we need to carefully watch our expenses during the year. The Branch continues to maintain a healthy bank balance but to preserve it we need to be careful. The branch continues to look for ways to raise money. Sir Hugh indicated that he would like to do a Power Point presentation to the membership in the August time frame to give them a current look at our financial situation and actions that should be taken. Sir Rob Ingebretson reported that today's speaker would be Susi Cherry and her dog Globie. Susi will speak to us on the work of Guide Dogs for the Blind. This Organization does outstanding work and we this lady will do



The occasion is the annual SIR Day at PAC Bell Park and there will be hundreds of Sons in Retirement members in the stands.




