Speaker Gari Browning by Little Sir Rob Ingebretson

President and Superintendent of Ohlone Community College District, Gari Browning, will be the speaker for the June luncheon.

Dr. Browning grew up in the greater Los Angeles area, attended Cypress College, and earned a baccalaureate degree from UC Irvine and M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from UCLA. She lived in the Dominican Republic, where she taught at the Universidad Católica Madre y Maestra and Hawaii, where she taught at the University of Hawaii.

Ohlone helps students learn and assists them to reach their educational goals. They offer a large selection of career and technical degrees designed to match the employer needs of our high technology region. They also feature an excellent transfer program.

Their programs prepare students for all UCs and CSUs and a large number of private universities in California and beyond. Ohlone transfer rate is one of the highest in the state, putting them at fifth out of 112 California Community Colleges. Students from Ohlone who transfer to a four-year university have a higher success rate than students who start there as freshmen.

Dr. Browning will update us on how things are going at Ohlone Community College.

Secretary's Report

Sir Jim Ferenz reported that at the State Annual Meeting two changes to the By-Laws were made. The first change allows Branches to charge dues if the Branch so moves. The second change establishes a State Budget Oversight Committee which would be responsible for tying State Goals to Budget expenses and revenues.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the new members.

Birthdays: Sir Art Winkley indicated we are celebrating 17 Birthdays ranging from 65 to

88. The Officers and Directors of SIR Branch 59 wish these men a very Happy Birthday.

The Pavilion will not open the bar in October and November due to a Bartender availability problem. Big Sir Skip Mugford will again address the chair issue with the Pavilion. We were led to believe that they would furnish the new chairs at all of our meetings. They now want to charge us \$1.00 per chair per meeting. If we give in to this demand we would have to raise the cost of the Luncheon. The Big Sir requests input from the membership on this issue. The members are reminded that the Christmas event will be on 12/19/13. We need volunteers to plan the event and as always door prizes are needed. Please plan on attending.

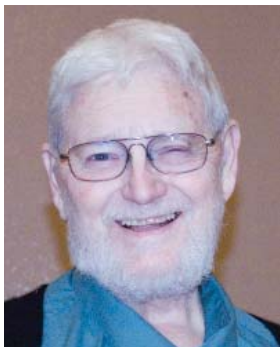
