Fortunately, Hugh was able to resolve the issue by obtaining the Pavilion's agreement to move our books to a suitable cabinet.

Many tables are often filled by friends who enjoy sitting together which is understandable. It was generally agreed that the most serious problem was making sure new members have a place to sit. Their sponsor should make sure that this

Last month were introduced to the new iPad Pro with the Apple pencil, and a few Apps that utilized the pencil were demonstrated. One of the Apps was a "Adult Coloring Book" and another a photo editing App that converted photos to B&W and then could be easily recolored to the original hues.

We also installed a new Solid State Drive (SSD) into SIR Charlie Wilkins' PC. This required physical installation of the new drive and then we used a Cloning App called AOMEI. The App was able to clone a single partition onto another drive. Unfortunately as of this writing Jerry is still having problems booting the new drive. More to follow.
