Sorry for the mix up, I was still suffering jet lag from my trip to Russia!


All subsequent meetings, September and onward, will be on the third Wednesday of each month.

SIR Branch 59 BEC Meeting, July 19, 2017 Meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by Big Sir Jim Ulam; the flag salute and roll call of Officers and Directors was conducted. All Officers

and Directors were present.

<u>Treasurer's Report and BEC</u> <u>Minutes:</u>

Sir Hugh Twomey reported that Branch finances are in good shape with a cash balance of \$3298.50 on July 19, 2017. Minutes of the June meeting and the Treasurer's report were approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Membership:

Sir Ron Brutvan reported that we will have 1 new member today and 1 potential member attending orientation.

Attendance

Sir Ed Guthrie reported the expected lunch attendance to be 112.

NEW BUSINESS

Big Sir Jim Ulam updated Form 27 and reported that the membership is now 155. That is an increase of 1 and meets the target set by the State SIR organization for year end. Of course, Branch 59's intention is to beat that target. He also passed out new recruiting "business cards" which designate the Elk Lodge as the location for our lunches.

Sir Rob Ingebretson, Area 15 Governor, reported that Region 5 evaluated its 27 branches in terms of recruitment, newsletter, website, etc. We are proud to learn that our Branch 59 was voted the best Branch in Region 5.

Big Sir Jim Ulam showed an automobile license plate holder that has been developed for SIR. The holder will be made available to members for \$2.00 during lunch today. A motion was made and passed to purchase 20 license plate holders to give to incoming new members.

Sir Nat Lord moved that 40 SIR "pins" be purchased for Branch inventory – the motion was passed.

Sir Bill Briscoe, who is also an Elk member, stated that all communications with the Elk staff and/or the caterer must be channeled through him, Jim Ulam or Hugh Twomey to avoid any possible confusion or misunderstandings.

Sir Jerry Sabo moved that Branch 59 pay Fred Gotthardt \$50.00 for the laptop he donated. The motion was passed.

Sir Arnold George moved that the following "regulations" be adopted to establish how the 6 Branch 59 Directors will be elected and to establish term limits for Directors:

"Directors will serve a single term of 3 years. Each year 2 new Directors will be elected and 2 existing Directors will retire after their 3-year term is up. During the transition period, 2 of the 6 existing Directors will voluntary to retire each year. Big Sir will resolve any issues regarding which 2 Directors will resign each year.

A Director who has already served a 3-year term will be eligible for reelection to another term after a 3-year break in service" (Cont Pg.6)

One of the big events every year is bowling at the National


Bowling Center in Reno, Nevada.

Region 5 "Best Branch"

Each Regional Director was asked to select a branch or branches that he felt had performed well this year and had a well developed RAMP program. There were four nominees. Each Area Governor plus the Regional Director was asked to select the top three. Since our Area Governor, Sir Rob Ingebretson, nominated our Branch 59 he was not allowed to vote for his own branch but had to vote for the other branches nominated. The votes were tabulated with five points given for first place, three points given for second place and one point given for third place.

Only two points separated the first three branches. Pathfinder Branch 59, which moved to Fremont in July, was first with 15 points. They began their Renaissance under the current Big Sir a year and a half ago. They have done a heck of a job and embraced RAMP. They also have an excellent website. Branch 59 is the only Branch in Area 15 (the East Bay) that is showing any life at all at a plus one member for the year with 154 members.

Branch 81, Rossmore was second with 166 members. Branch 8, Mount Diablo was third with 349 members. Branch 69 Pony Express (Sacramento) was fourth with 150 members
