
Guest Speaker District Attorney Nancy O'Malley

DA O'Malley is a nationally recognized expert in issues involving violence against women, violence against persons with disabilities, and interpersonal violence including sexual assault, domestic violence, elder abuse, child abuse, stalking, and human exploitation and trafficking. She serves in an office with a national reputation for excellence dating back to former District Attorney and United States Supreme Court Chief Justice Earl Warren. DA O'Malley carries out this proud legacy as the first woman to serve as Alameda County's elected District Attorney, and as a leader known throughout California and the country for her innovation and vision.

Big Sir Harvey McAninch strongly encouraged the Nominating Committee to expedite its efforts to find candidates for all officer, director and assistant director positions.

NEW BUSINESS

Big Sir Harvey McAninch commented on Form 27. Branch 59 membership is just barely keeping up with attrition even with the inflow of new members from the Elks. The need to bring new members, especially the younger ones, into active participation in the operation of Branch 59 was reemphasized. Recruiting Chairman Sir Jim Ulam commented that, in addition to sponsored candidates, one new candidate applied in response to our newspaper ad. The use of the SIR business cards as valuable recruiting tool was encouraged. Also, the importance of sponsors making sure their candidates are introduced around and seated at a welcoming table was emphasized.

Big Sir Harvey McAninch recommended that new members be asked about their previous employment, hobbies, family etc. during the installation ceremony. The suggestion was welcomed and approved by the BEC.

Sir Rob Ingebretson gave a progress report on the Country Western theme May Sweetheart Luncheon and encouraged members to sign up asap.


bowling a scratch series of 621, with games of 192, 214 & a 215. Last year's winner
