BUILDING THE FLAG

The purposes of this program are

to promote patriotism and Americanism and to nurture The love of our country and its flag. The program is given by three men in uniforms of

The Continental Army worn during the American Revolution. They are Masons who

have served as commissioned Officers in the Armed Forces of the United States or an allied nation.

The 35-minute program begins as a large flag is carried in by two soldiers. After we

Repeat the pledge of allegiance, the significance of folding the flag 13 times into a triangle is explained.

A soldier explains how and when each of the original 13 colonies came into the union. As he does so, two soldiers place alternate red and white stripes on the flag and the field of blue. After the significance of the colors is explained, the evolution of the flag from the Continental Flag, the Betsy Ross Flag, the Star-Spangled Banner is described, while the roll is called for our 50-star flag of today.

And finally, accompanied by stirring music, a monologue entitled "I am the flag of the United States of America" is given that tells what the flag is, where it has been, and what it represents to all of us. On some occasions where time and situation permit, the poem" A Toast to the Flag" is given as the conclusion to the presentation.
