
No specific topic has been scheduled for our August session.

# THE NEW MATH FOR A HEALTHIER YOU


A growing chorus of doctors think we fixate on health related numbers that are outdated (like weight). Here's What to let go of——and what to pay more attention to——for your body's benefit.

\*\*OBSESS LESS\*\*

10,000 STEPS A DAY

Counting steps can be fun, and has this upside: you are apt to log an extra mile a day, research shows. but 10,000 steps is not a magic number.

\*\*OBSESS LESS\*\*
BODY-MASS INDEX (BMI)
From middle age on, you can lose 3 percent of muscle mass a year, a leading cause of disability, insulin resistance, and related health woes. Forget BMI. Do resistance training (with bands or weights) at least two to three times a week.



# \*\*FOCUS MORE\*\* 300 MINUTES A WEEK OF SWEAT

Better than using your phone to count steps, use it to time how long you sweat. Aim for a minimum of 30 minutes, 5 to 7 days a week.

# \*\*FOCUS MORE\*\* WAIST SIZE

More reliable than the scale or BMI to flag health risks is the simple act of measuring around your waist. For men, the goal is under 40 inches; for women, 35 inches. The most reliable was waist-to-height ratio (WHtR). A man 6 feet tall should have a waist under 36 inches; a women who's 5-foot-4 should aim for under 32 inches. You can find simple WHtR calculators online.

220 MINUS YOUR AGE

(MAX HEART RATE)

Key for all: Slow down if you are straining; push if it's easy.



# \*\*FOCUS MORE\*\* TRIGLYCERIDES BELOW 150 MG/DL

Your cholesterol numbers highlight your risk of diabetes, heart disease and Alzheimer's but don't forget your triglycerides. A type of fat in the blood, when levels above 150 mg/dL are treated with medication, diet and exercise, benefits follow. "When triglycerides go down, good cholesterol goes up.

# SONS IN RETIREMENT (Tri-cities area) a.k.a. SIR Social Activities for Men



## **Are you SIRious?** by Larry Jett



Sir Ken Brunskill, born in Denver CO in 1939, but like so many families, relocated to the Bay Area to build ships for WWII. His Mom was a welder. The Brunskills left Oakland for Castro Valley where Ken graduated from Hayward High in 1956 and enlisted in the Navy for 4 years. After Electronics school he cruised the world on the USS Merrick AKA/LKA-97 (an attack cargo ship...these fill the actual landing craft with tanks and men, plus

Australia, all the Caribbean's and 4 trips to New Zealand. Back on dry land, Ken attended the University of San Francisco with a degree in Business 1978 all the while will working in the engineering world.

Post college and the Navy, Ken served as a Tool and Die Apprentice from 1961 to 1965, a Tool Designer until 1972, then a Manufacturing Engineer until 1978, Engineering Manager until 1986, capped by the title Senior Project Engineer until retirement in 1998. Paychecks arrived in those years from Ampex, Lenkurt Electric, Memorex, Xerox, Zilog, Conner Peripherals, Read-Rite, Integrated Solutions, and half a dozen others.

Ken won the heart of a coed at Laney Trade school and Pat and Ken have been holding hands for 59 years. A son and a daughter produced an additional grandson and granddaughter.

The art of fly-fishing was learned from his dad and uncle and became a serious endeavor in the 80's. Ken has caught 10 of the 11 legally available NATIVE trout in CA earning him the "California Heritage Trout Challenge" award. Ken founded and is still active with Veterans First Fly Fishing. This group has taken veterans throughout Montana, Oregon, and California under the auspices of the VA and Fly Fishers International. It is an all-volunteer group wanting to assist veterans to integrate back into society. As yet another retirement project, Ken leads the effort to rebuild many major parts of a 1911 Vulcan steam locomotive used for yard switching. Ask him about either project, and he will cheerfully provide further intel. What other SIR can claim to have fly-fished from a live steam locomotive? Sponsors were Al Kenney and Steve Francis.

In all respects, a life led very well.
