

Bruce Roberts — Auto something

The sight blew me away! A B-52D landed that day with its vertical stabilizer folder over, lying flat. Was it shot up? No, during maintenance someone forgot to secure a bolt. The amazing pilot managed to bring the huge bomber into Kadena AB, Okinawa for a perfect landing. I thought - someone is going to get fired over this! It was sometime during my April or May, 1967, my TDY to Okinawa from Travis AFB, CA. Not many of

the guys who flew out of Travis to Viet Nam knew SAC (Strategic Air Command) was a tenant with BUFFs and KC-135 tankers an the base. I watched many a strangely named airline lift-off bound for Vietnam while stationed there 1967-1970. Color blind a bit, I could not fly so they made me an Aircraft Maintenance Officer. CMS Newton and I cruised the flight line to "help" the Field Maintenance Airmen and NCOs do their job.

Born in Boise, ID, (2-4-44) while my dad was in Belgium with the 654th Eng, Div., my mom and I stayed at my grandparents' Ladlaw house until he returned in 1945 when we moved to Twin Falls. Because my dad signed up for the Reserves, he was called up for the Korean War. We (sister Julie included) drove their '49 DeSoto to Alexandria, VA in late '51 while he underwent training at Fort Belvoir. Back in Boise, I entered the second grade Central School. Sister Patricia entered the family in late '52—I spent the last few months before she was born in Muldoon, ID, the site of my grandfather's ranch. What a special summer, play, fish and hike with my cousins, heaven for an eight-year old. Back to Twin Falls when my dad returned from Japan, my brother Scott showed up in 1956. He now lives in Newport, WA, Julie in Lewiston, Patricia in Pocatello, ID.

I graduated from Twin Falls High School in 1962, started at The College of Idaho that fall, and graduated in '66 (business degree). My summers ('64—'66) I spent as an Interregional firefighter for the Forest Service out of McCall, ID. Lots of hard work and tales from those days. The draft caught up with me after graduation, but I had the choice to do my service as an officer. After my 70 days in OTS my college sweetheart Julie and I married in Caldwell, ID, and we moved to Rantoul, IL, where I underwent training on jet engines and other aircraft components. Then got my USA based assignment at Travis. After the TDY in Okinawa, I was assigned to aircraft Plans and Scheduling at Travis, and finished up my SAC AF career as a captain. The NCOs were the real specialists!

With an early out for education, I spent a couple of years in Seattle at the U of W working for an MBA. My daughter Robin was born in Seattle. Job prospects were few at that time. Meier & Frank in Portland employed me for three years as an Assistant Buyer. Then Michelin called in 1975. Although Sears' RoadHandler tires were manufactured by Michelin, they did not want the public to know, so my sales training for Sears employees (from Bellingham to Bakersfield and San Francisco to Denver) attempted to keep the secret. That didn't last long as Michelin was starting to gain a reputation for longer lasting tires on its own. In 1993, while on a backpacking trip in the Sierras, I found out that Michelin dissolved my job. I then worked with Bay Area (and beyond) commercial dealers promoting Michelin truck and off-road tires. With all that experience my next job was liaison work with very large commercial fleets in California and my wife and I divorced in 1999 and I remarried in 2002. Joan passed away in 2013. Single since then, I met Madelyn in 2018 and we have enjoyed each other's company since then.

Throughout my life, maybe since I was eight years old, I've had a yen for art as an appreciator, and, as a see-er, photography has grown to be a passion of mine. Not ever approaching professional status, I've just enjoyed photography as art in my head, always happy to share photos with those who might like some of the images I snag.

From time to time I try my hand at writing, but my head was not built for fiction. I usually write to an end, a description of life or things.

Again, an appreciator, I enjoy most music genres, but I admit to being a folkie. My music collection includes records, cassettes, CDs and now streamed music. Maybe streamed music is a good thing – where am I going to put all the records, etc.?

Lesson and values: Tell the truth, listen and speak when you really have something to say, thrift. A church member since I can remember (OK a few errant years), I try to listen to Jesus and do as he asked. Since 1981 I've been a member of St. James' Episcopal Church in Fremont. A longtime choir member, I participate in many activities with the Church community. Bud Pearson suggested that I might like to join SIR. I enjoy SIR and I'm glad you let me take a few photos now and then.
