Musings of Big Sir Larry Jett

It is a trifle early for a "State Of The Club" assessment since we have had but two face-to-face lunch meetings this year and the previous Zoom meetings seldom had an attendance count greater than 24 viewers. The two recent lunch

meetings at the Elk's Lodge attracted about 50 percent of our 147 members compared to the average of 69 percent attending throughout precovid 2019.

The consequences of a fixed rental of the Lodge, the reduced number of attendees, and an increase in the price of the lunch in the 18 months since we had to suspend indoor meetings means that our Branch checking account spends \$300 more than members pay for the meal at the current state of affairs since reopening in September. Some generous gents have written checks to keep our treasury balance level but that shouldn't have to be.

Until your BEC comes to grips with fiscal first-aid, how can you help?

- Come to the lunch. \$5 of the lunch fee goes to the Elks so it takes 120 Sirs to cover the \$600 rental.
- <u>Tell Ed Guthrie</u> if you know you can not make it so less food is ordered. The week before the meeting is preferable.

Our meeting was held in person at the Fremont Elks Lodge.

The meeting was called to order by Big Sir Larry Jett at 10:05 am. All BEC members were present except Dave Shideler.

The September 15, 2021 meeting minutes were approved as presented.

Treasurer, Larry Lardie reported the balance of the general fund was \$3,736.40. Our luncheon expense in September was \$288 more than

receipts. We received a generous \$500 donation as well. The treasure's report was approved.

Our planned presentation today was regarding law enforcement, however, due to the weather and our decision to meet inside the speaker declined to join us. Instead, Bob Marshall will present an autobiographical account of his involvement with music.

Bob Marshall discussed the need for a better PA system for our meetings. He is investigating several options including use of some of his own equipment or our branch buying a system.

Membership: Our current membership stands at 148. This includes one new member, Jerry Reynolds. Rob mentioned we have not had new members affirm the SIR oath when they are introduced during our luncheons, as had been done in the past. Although the oath is discussed during orientations, it was agreed we present the oath when introducing new members going forward.

The SIR oath consists of four expectations of its members: • Be a friendly, sociable guy • Participate in our activities, luncheons and events • Volunteer when asked • Bring guests and introduce them to SIR so we can perpetuate the organization.

A member has made a request to announce an opportunity to members about being involved with the "DOOR" project. It involves bringing awareness to people about the pandemic and vaccines and pays \$20 per hour. Rob will write an article for the Pathfinder.

Attendance: 22 members were unexcused for our September meeting. This is an issue with regard to how many meals are prepared, paid for and then go wasted. Each member is obligated to call Ed Guthrie if they are unable to attend a meeting.

Nominations: Rick is looking for someone to fill the position of Little Sir for 2022. The nominations for the other BEC positions are Big Sir, Bob Marshall. Secretary, Dave Nelsen. Assistant Secretary, Rob Ingebretson. Treasurer, Larry Lardie. Assistant Treasurer, James Vermazen. Directors; Hugh Twomey, Sammy Lum, Jerry Halligan, Jim Ulam, Richard Henry, and Dave Shideler. Bob Marshall will lead the election of the 2022 Branch Executive Committee officers during our meeting today.

This is about 28% of membership participating in activities. There was much discussion on how we might encourage and increase member involvement in activities.

How Woolie Can You Get?



This Story about woolies started over twenty-five years ago on John Peavey's ranch, Flat Top Sheep Company. Sheep ranching in central Idaho, eastern Oregon, western Montana and Wyoming, and northern Nevada had flourished since before the beginning of the 20th century. Although mining for silver, lead and gold and other precious metals had rushed in and faded away, raising sheep for wool and lamb had long sustained the economy in these areas. John Peavey decided that sheep ranching should be celebrated. Because of his vision, the Trailing of the Sheep Festival celebrated its 25th anniversary on October 6-11, 2021 in Ketchum, Hailey and Bellevue, Idaho.

Each year the organizers have attempted to commemorate "all things sheep," from book authors to ranchers to sheep dogs, from photographers to knitters, from story tellers to cheese makers. Each year's festival has been different, with one exception, the actual trailing of sheep down Main Street, Ketchum, Idaho, on the last day of



the festival. Sure, one might see camp wagons, horses, Scottish bagpipers, Basque dancers, Peruvian musicians and dancers, and more, but the culmination of the parade has been and will continue

to be sheepherders and dogs herding 1500 to 2000 sheep right down Main Street. The sheep, just down from the high country (up to 10,000 feet) to Ketchum (almost 5900 feet itself), are on their way to lower and

warmer climes. They will trek over 100 miles to destinations near the Snake River to spend the winter. The parade in Ketchum is just the start of the march. Check the view: thousands of sheep "fans" line

both sides of the street, craning their necks, peering north to catch sight of the first sheep in the band. As the sheep pass by the onlookers, they step back to let the sheep and sheep dogs pass. The sheep, mostly orderly, eye the spectators, wondering what all the fuss is about, and the onlookers stare back, knowing that sheep ranching sustains the economy year after year.



Even the Festival itself supports the three towns with the tourists who flock

to the festival for a good time. It's the last hurrah before the beginning of ski season (Sun Valley next to Ketchum). This year Trailing of the Sheep ended on Sunday, and it snowed the first snow of the season that night, impeccable timing! The Hailey Airport is busier than most of the close-by towns

with airports.



The BIG REASON for my visit this year stemmed from the dedication of the Sheepherder Monument in Hailey, located near the main highway and the booming airport. The monument consists of a full-sized, saddled horse, a sheepherder holding the horse's reins, a sheepdog staring down a recalcitrant sheep, and a few more sheep awaiting the outcome of the stare-down. Brass plaques naming pioneer sheep ranchers



and surrounding, incised bricks complete the monument. Yes, my grandfather, James Laidlaw, is among the names in brass or brick commemorating the sheep-ranching business. I found it kind of heartwarming to see my hard-working grandfather's name on the monument. That's how woolie it gets!
