Little Sir Bob Marshall said he would have a short 15 minute Christmas presentation for our December meeting as well as some possible singers.

Membership: Report by me informed the BEC that we were going to introduce our newest member, Russell Pennelly to the group but that will be postponed until our December meeting. We also have a new guest, Mike Baratz, who will join us at the December meeting. We now have 149 members.

Nomination: Rick Henry approached a couple of members with the hope of filling the vacancy for a new Little Sir for 2022 but was unsuccessful.

Activities: Larry Lardie informed us that our bowling team placed 3rd in the B division at the state tournament in Modesto. 

My Hole in One – On the Road

As a Battalion Chief in charge of the Training Division 1969 in the Pasadena Fire Department, I joked with Assistant Fire Chief Jim Kane that I should be one of the people to check out the three new fire pumpers the Department had just bought. I needed to train other firemen, so I needed the experience. Manufactured in Elmira, New York, the Ward La France

pumpers (containing hoses, pumps, and a water tank) required inspection, possible modification, and transport from the plant to Pasadena. Cost analysis showed that it would be more cost effective for Pasadena personnel to perform those functions than to have the units shipped to, inspected and modified in Pasadena.

Chief Kane, myself and the equipment shop foreman were chosen to fly to New York, inspect the pumpers, wait for any modifications to be made and then drive them to Pasadena. The question was what to do with the time while La France made required modifications? One morning we played nine holes of golf at the Elmira golf course near the Elmira plant. In those days I had a pretty good golf game, and that day I was doing rather well, both on the fairway and on the greens. On the fifth hole, a par three of course, I swung "for the fences," and scuffed the shot. The ball bounced down the fairway and on to the green, I thought. When we walked up to the green, my ball was nowhere to be found. To my surprise and everyone else's, we found the ball next to the flag - in the hole! The others congratulated me, and I felt pretty good about it as well, even if I had muffed the shot. I don't remember who had the lowest score, but it must have been me.

The trip back to Pasadena was probably a lot of fun for Chief Kane and our foreman because they had their wives to accompany them. I drove by myself with only the radio for company; it was a long trip. One bright spot occurred in Columbus, Ohio, our second night on the road. My cousin, Bill Hamilton, was the early morning DJ. He and I chatted on the phone that night. The next morning, as I was driving out of town listening to the radio, I heard Bill tell his audience, "Good citizens of Ohio, show your hospitality and wave to the firemen as they drive west to California." We drove through Indianapolis that day, the day before the Indianapolis 500 Race in 1969, finally won by Mario Andretti on his fifth attempt. The new, state of the art pumpers checked out just fine; we arrived back in Pasadena after two weeks, a flight, a golf game and a long, long drive (in the pumper, not the hole in one).
