The day the Strategic Air Command was grounded By Sir Larry Jett

This narrative started on a fairly typical weekend day in late 1990 when I took a collector car to a Concours d' Elegance; this in Palo Alto. The car of choice was a 1960 Chrysler 300F of which but 681 were made that year. My hardtop coupe was rare enough but soon a 300F convertible arrives and parks next to me in the Stanford show field. I had never heard of the driver or the car before. Only 123 rag-tops were ever produced for 1960. Since we had plenty to talk about, I learned that "Earl" had a need for a

super rare air cleaner for one of the 2 carbs. I was to be at a Chrysler 300 national meet later in the year in Massachusetts so I got his phone number (no smartphones in 1990) and we parted company.



At the meet, I had a conversation with an auto-literature sales kiosk owner and was told he believed he had a spare air cleaner at home. On faith alone, I gave him \$50 and it arrived in Newark four weeks later. Earl was overjoyed to find the missing piece to perfection and found my asking price of \$50 unfathomable but was delighted to pay so little.

End of story? Hardly.....August 16th 1991. I get a 'franked' envelope (no stamps required) in the mail from the Department of the Air Force, HQ of the 940th Air Refueling

Group out of Mather Air Force Base, close to Sacramento. Chief Public Affairs officer, 1st Lt Susan Gentry sharing that Air Force Major Earl (last name redacted) was the requestor. Earl never shared he was in the military reserves but he was now inviting me to a Civic Leader Flight on September 28th 1991 where Air Force reservists would train and maybe 18 civilians (us civic leaders!) would observe these young men fueling F-14s in the air from a KC-135F Stratotanker. Wow! I was in high school in 1957 in Renton WA when Boeing was developing these planes that were tested as KC-135s and evolved into the Boeing 707 passenger airframe. They flew over our high school PE grass to land nearby and we could see the rivets on the wings as they were so low.

While airborne, it was fascinating to all us non military folks to see 20 year+ men laying on their bellies at the rear of the plane looking down to earth through thick glass and controlling fuel boom sticks at many miles per hour connecting with fighter jets but 20 feet below them. As us non-coms crowded up next to the 'kids" doing the work, we all acquired stories to tell when we got home, not to mention visual memories that would not be bested by anyone in future cocktail party conversations.. None of us knew how big the story was to get before the day was over.

After a while, the PA system tells that some F-16s from Lemoore were approaching for some simulated dog-fight activities out in the Pacific (shades of Top Gun) and just before we left for home, we became tourists over Half Moon Bay before headed back to Mather.

Late in the afternoon upon landing we found a crowd of military awaiting our arrival. Pretty much all of Mather as at attention, why? because starting in 1957 the SAC has been on 24/7 alert with planes constantly in the air to strike immediately if the USSR went first. On this day the order was for all bombers in the air and all Minute Man II pieces should stand-down, remove all intellectual property and turn over planes and ordinance to MAINTENANCE. All classified stuff to be removed at dusk and the SAC planes grounded. (side intelligence: the SAC capability is still there but it takes longer to get going). The Joint Chiefs of Staff declared: "The cold-war is over and we have WON"







The story below is meant to be a teaser!

What it's like to be hijacked

The Gripping Tale of an Unscheduled Visit to Tehran



"We think they got on at Jeddah, that they were Yemenese — from Northern Yemen,"said Jerry Robertson. "They entered the cockpit about 25 minutes out of Jeddah, held a gun on the stewardess, forced her to open the door."

Robertson was describing an adventure that held him and Ivan Stuart captive in mid-air on November 6, election day in the U.S., and delayed their arrival in Riyadh, the capital of Saudi Arabia, by 26 hours. High point of the adventure was an unscheduled stop in Tehran, complete with "welcome" by Iranian military forces.

The two NEBO men were on their way to discuss details of a training program with officials of the Saudi government. They had flown to London and switched to the Saudia Airlines for the eight hour continuation to Riyadh, via Jeddah. At the intermediate stop, passengers had to deplane, clear customs, and reboard.

"We grumbled about their security," Robertson recalled. "We had been through security in London, hadn't been `out'. Their machines were

sensitive enough that we had to take keys from our pockets and remove watches. In fact, Ivan had to take his ring off to get through the metal detector!

"And these skyjackers somehow got through with a gun, providing us a free ride to Tehran!"
