BIG SIR JERRY MUSING



The meeting was called to order by Big Sir Jerry Halligan at 10:00am. All BEC members were present except Rick Henry.

The June 21 meeting minutes were approved as presented. The meeting minutes of a special meeting held on June 30 were also approved as presented. Dave mentioned a correspondence from Alan Baker, State Web Guru, announcing a Zoom meeting he will be holding on July 21 to discuss improving branch email deliverability through effective email lists and optimized websites.

Larry Lardie reported the balance of our account was \$7,950.82 on July 19. Expenses this month included a quarterly assessment of \$264. The Treasurer's report was approved.

Big Sir Jerry announced his duty this month is to submit our BEC nomination for next year's Area Representative to SIR State. Fred Serena, our current Area Representative, put forth his nomination last month. Asking for additional nominations from the floor and receiving none, the BEC voted unanimously to have Fred represent us at SIR State in 2024. In August we are to inform SIR State our slate of BEC officers for 2024.

Little Sir, Bill Bauhofer, announced that after careful consideration, he will not be able to fill the position of Big Sir next year. This gives the BEC an opportunity and the task to nominate a Big Sir and Little Sir from the branch membership to lead us in 2024.

Rick Henry offered to fill the role of nominating chairman next year. Bob Marshall offered to speak with Rick and work with him now to find Big Sir and Little Sir candidates for next year.

Rob Ingebretson suggested we invite more members to attend our BEC meetings, which will help spur interest and familiarity with our processes and lead to more BEC members.

Membership; Rob Ingebretson indicated we expect three new members today. Vince Sinesio, Bob Gonzalez and Ray Gauthier. Their membership was approved by the BEC.

Attendance; Phil reported we expect about 82 members and guests for lunch today. About 40 members consistently do not respond to the invitation to attend our luncheons. Rob Ingebretson suggests we call these members to understand whether there is an issue we can address.

Activities; There was a bowling tournament recently in Clayton and another planned in Reno in August. 12 to 14 members meet for golf each Tuesday. They play at Spring Valley in Milpitas.

Recruitment; Jim Ulam spoke of a meeting being held by SIR State this Friday regarding recruitment. Bob Marshall suggested we participate in Newark Days held on the second weekend of September. There is a community education area where different groups set up tables to distribute fliers and inform the public about their organization. A motion to participate in this event was made and the BEC approved it. A pop-up tent, table, marketing information and volunteers need to be organized in August.

Publicity; Bob Marshall has been given access to the branch Facebook page and an advertisement in Tri-City Voice will commence again soon.

Marketing; Rob Perrill referred to the special marketing meeting held on June 30 when we all agreed that displaying signage and wearing apparel with the SIR logo would increase our visibility, draw interest to our organization and promote growth of our membership. He asked whether funds are available to purchase such items and what the process will be to move forward. Much discussion ensued. Thoughts included our branch buying apparel for members of an activity group, having individuals of a group purchase the apparel themselves, or sharing the cost between the branch and individuals. We resolved that we need to speak with each major activity chairman to understand what apparel would be most effective as a marketing tool for their group, what color, sizes and numbers would be needed. This would lead to a budget need so the BEC could determine how to make it happen.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:02am



Hayward Past and Present in One Walk

Dubbed by Jerry Ford as The Mural Walk, the seven of us learned history, felt sorry for downtown, found restaurants, and were awed by the expansive murals decorating the large walls of Hayward's downtown. Started as a method of combating graffiti, these mostly immense "paintings" show Hayward's past and present, Russell City, agriculture, car racing, and the glories of the movies - to state the subject of a few of the murals. Distance-wise it was a short walk, but we really saw a slice of the downtown Hayward that one whizzes by when one drives through it.

The Russell City mural shows the good times that once were had there. We viewed probably the original Round Table Pizza location and Casper's Hot Dogs (too early to stop in). Traffic control boxes painted so your eyes would go wonky startled us as we waited for the lights to change. Murals on the Century Theater showed us what we remember about really going to the movies.

Traffic is loud and fast on Mission Blvd. and Foothill. Downtown is having a hard time with closed businesses and more closing. The 9/11 memorial shows great thought and is worth visiting by itself. The nearby park reminds me of city parks of my boyhood. The first mural we saw showed the stone torches on the second City Hall "being set up" and there they were near the top of the City Hall, very impressive.
