As we head into autumn we have much to look forward to:

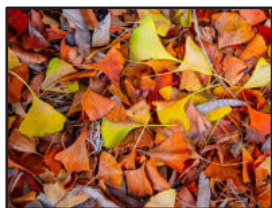

I hope you all take the time to "live for today" as Albert advised, and enjoy your family, friends, and fellowship.

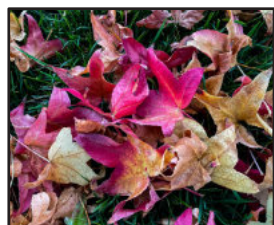

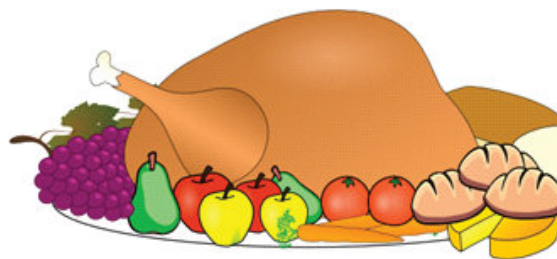


NOVEMBER GUEST SPEAKER

Sir Bob Marshall



Bob Marshall's libertarian roots come from his over 31 years of government service as a Newark City Planning Commissioner and City Council Member, and his life experiences with all sorts of folks. He's been an Oakland Tribune daily delivery boy; a gas pump jockey at his uncle's station; a union grocery clerk, a dental technician and Vietnam Era veteran of 4 years in the U.S. Navy, a union construction worker, a Real Estate appraiser for 40 years, and the aforementioned government work. Couple this with his upbringing in a family with old fashioned values, and his childhood around friends who were hunters, and had ever kind of gun known to man; and he is uniquely qualified to be a defender of the 2nd Amendment. His talk will encompass both the pros and the cons of this part of the U.S. Constitution and provide some very interesting information about guns in general from the libertarian perspective.

The meeting was called to order by Big Sir Jerry Halligan at 10:00am. All BEC members were present except James Vermazen.

The Sept 20 meeting minutes; Jerry suggested the minutes be amended to clarify the motion we approved regarding budgeting \$100 [per month] to be spent on gifts, awards and promotional products. The minutes were approved as amended. Form 20, SIR Branch Administrative Personnel for Year 2024, was sent to the State Roster Chairman on Sept 23 indicating our Officer Elects for 2024.

Larry Lardie reported the balance of our account was \$7,281.18 on Oct 18. This includes several standard expenses and our 4th quarter assessment payment of \$264. The Treasurer's report was approved.

Jerry Halligan reported on correspondence from Carl Mason, the Sir State Treasurer. The State Board has approved a cost increase of SIR dues. Starting January 1, 2024, per-capita dues for the branches will be raised \$0.50 per quarter from \$2 per member to \$2.50. Last month I reported the dues would be raised to \$2.25. Following a review of our current finances the State Board decided that would not be adequate.

Attendance; Phil reported we expect between 75 and 80 people for lunch today. Phil collects great data each month through the Evite program. It is surprising how many members have not attended any, or very few, lunch meetings. Some of these can be attributed to a group of members who bowl every Wednesday. Phil announced he will retire as attendance chairman several months ago. A replacement for this important role has not yet been found. Rob Ingebretson offered to call potential candidates.

Activities; Larry Lardie indicated golf attendance has been light due to many regular players traveling. He anticipates attendance will go up again.

Publicity; Bob Marshall brought a denim vest he adorned with SIR logo and Branch 59 lettering. He will speak about this at today's luncheon. He offered to purchase the components to make this vest for any number of members, possibly reducing the overall cost with volume discounts. He spent \$70 for the vest, logo, patches and set of lettering.

New Projector; Sammy has researched different projectors and is focused on a ViewSonic with 3800 Lumens which would cost \$351. He and Ken Brunskill will be investigating whether this will be adequate brightness for our space. A motion was made to allow Sammy to spend up to \$500 for a new projector. The motion was approved.

Holiday Luncheon; Tickets go on sale today and Rob "Inge" will make an announcement during today's meeting about November sales and urge members to solicit prizes from their favorite business to donate to the event. Rob will send a solicitation form letter via email to members. A motion was made to allow Rob to spend up to \$1,500 for the Holiday Luncheon. The motion was approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:56am

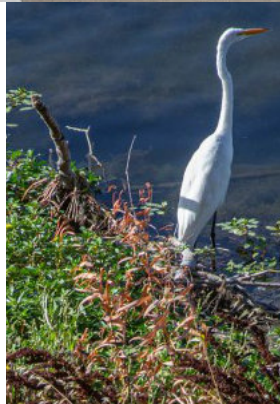
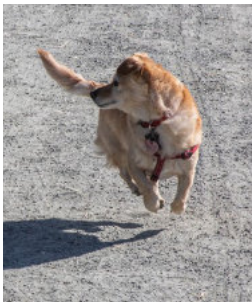
More to Niles Than Main Street

A fun morning it was. Some of us stopped for coffee afterwards. ~ Bruce Roberts



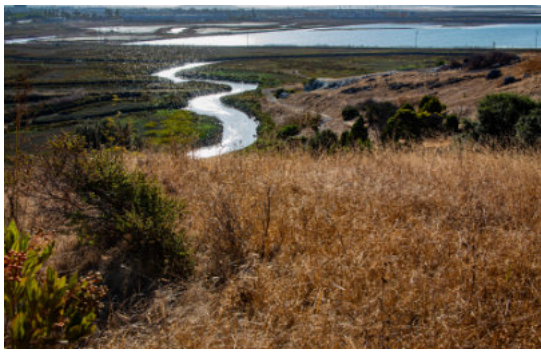

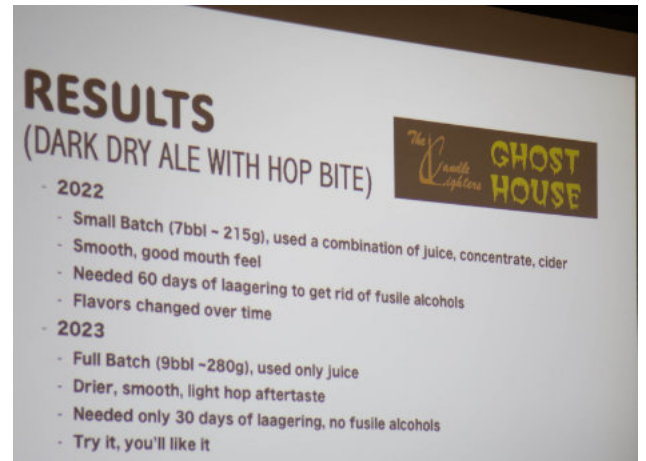
