The meeting was called to order by Big Sir Jerry Halligan at 10:03am. All BEC members were present except James Vermazen, Bob Marshall and Phil Keller.

The Aug 16 meeting minutes were approved as presented. Based on the Schedule of Branch Operations the secretary is to submit Form 20 in September to the State Roster Chairman indicating our Officer Elects for 2024. To that end, a motion was made to approve the following nominees to serve as officers to Branch 59 in 2024; Rob Ingebretson as Big Sir, Rob Perrill as Little Sir, Dave

Nelsen as Secretary and Larry Lardie as Treasurer. The motion was approved unanimously.

Larry Lardie reported the balance of our account was \$7,891.65 on Sept 20. This includes several standard expenses and one very special donation of \$1,000 from Sir Arthur Winkley. Art has been a member of Branch 59 since 1992 and is, in fact, an honorary Life Member. All BEC members express their gratitude for your generous donation. The Treasurer's report was approved.

Jerry Halligan reported on the SIR State Annual Meeting held on August 31. One discussion point was the assessment. Currently the assessment is \$2 per member per quarter. For branch 59 this equates to \$264 in October. SIR State announced this will increase to \$2.25 beginning in 2024. Much of this is to cover the cost of insurance for all branches. SIR State Vice President Dale Decker (2024 President Elect) mentioned there are currently 84 SIR Branches. About one third of these branches are increasing membership and about one third of these branches are closing. Dale indicated that SIR membership has declined in the last six months from 9,200 to 8,830 members. He emphasized the need to attract new members.

Attendance/Membership; Rob Ingebretson reported we expect 79 for lunch today, including guests and speakers. We have three new members expected to join us today. Ron Shore, Doug Laidlaw and Mike McDonald. Their membership was approved by the BEC.

Activities; Larry Lardie indicated golf attendance is strong at 16 participants. Bowling is also seeing strong attendance at 16 to 18 every Monday. Bocce Ball and Walkers are also seeing good attendance, while pickle-ball and corn-hole have not seen much interest.

Two new activities have been suggested; Billiards and a breakfast group. We will measure interest in these possible activities during today's luncheon.

Publicity; Newark Days Community Information Faire on Sunday, Sept 17. Rob Perrill reported the event attracted a younger age group that would be interested in our organization. With that said, a number of solid connections were made. Several Sir members volunteered at the booth and had a wonderful time talking with people about SIR Branch 59.

A number of purchases are made each month, including apparel, pins and wine to award or give to members. The concern is, these expenses are not budgeted. A motion was made to approve up to \$100 be spent on gifts, awards and promotional products by the Membership Chairman. The motion was approved by the BEC.

Jerry Sabo explained that our projector broke a while ago and we have been using his projector. A new one needs to be purchased soon.

Rob Ingebretson asked for volunteers to help organize our holiday luncheon. Several BEC members offered to help. Rob will invite volunteers to a planning lunch soon to discuss and make plans for this event.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:00am

The Centerville Story




