





Trains on the Moon? Northrop Grumman Is Studying How to Build a Lunar RailroadThe project is part of lunar infrastructure study from D research and development

A US government agency has selected aerospace provider Northrop Grumman to develop a concept for building a railroad network on the Moon.

infrastructure study from DARPA, the research and development agency under the Department of Defense. Last year, it launched the study to focus on how the US and international partners

DARPA wants to do so through a "series develop the James Webb Space of shareable, scalable systems that interoperate," making it easier to build out the lunar infrastructure for purposes including mining, energy, and agriculture. One primary goal is to "catalyze widespread activity on and around the Moon over the next ten years (2025-2035), as well as out to 2050," the agency said.

The timeline aligns with NASA's Artemis program, which is aiming to return humans to the Moon with a landing near the south pole in 2026.

Northrop Grumman now savs it's been selected to focus on transit for the future lunar colony. "The envisioned lunar railroad network could transport

humans, supplies and resources for commercial ventures across the lunar surface—contributing to a space economy for the United States and international partners," the company said in the announcement.

Northrop Grumman, which helped Telescope, didn't share much else. But the company says it's been tasked with figuring out what resources it'll need to build the lunar railroad network, along with determining the costs. Another aim is to identify prototypes and "explore concepts for constructing and operating the system with robotics."

"With our proven experience in the integration of complex systems and commercialized autonomous services. we will continue to create lasting change for a sustainable space ecosystem," added company VP Chris Adams.


