The meeting was called to order by President Rob Ingebretson at 10:00am. All BEC members were present except Mark Silvera and Bob Marshall.

The June 19 meeting minutes were approved as presented. Per the Schedule of Branch Operations, July is the month the BEC should elect our 2025 Branch Officers.

Treasurer, Larry Lardie reported the balance of our account was \$8,419.40 on July 17. The treasurer's report was approved.

A motion was made to accept the slate of officers who have offered to serve Branch 59 in 2025; As President, Rob Perrill. Vice President, Rick Henry. Secretary, Dave Nelsen. Treasurer, Larry Lardie. Assistant Treasurer, Mark Silvera. Also five directors; Ken Brunskill, Bob Marshall, Jerry Ford, Sammy Lum and Nat Lord. The motion was approved. The secretary will submit form 20 by the end of the month.

Ingy reported on the business meeting held on July 3 at Suju's Coffee. Much of our time was spent discussing a zoom meeting held on June 26 by SIR State. It was nearly a 2 and 1/2 hour long meeting where many dramatic changes to the SIR organization, being considered by the State Board, were presented for discussion, questions and comments.

Vice President, Rob Perrill, reported that we expect 3 new members to join us today; Kevin Finnerty, Bert Agilera and Jim Hall. Their membership was approved by the BEC. Several first time guests are also expected to join us today.

Rob shared a wonderful letter written by Miguel Ferras as an invitation to join the bowling group which he chairs. This would be a good practice for all activity chairmen. Having a short letter to share with a member or perspective member with a description of their activity, timing and contact information would help increase participation.

Ken Brunskill, attendance chair, reported we expect 78 members and guests for today's luncheon.

Area Representative, Fred Serena, discussed some of the changes being considered to the SIR organization by SIR State officers. There are several reasons they feel changes need to be made; While 36% of branches are growing in membership, 36% are slowly declining and 28% are rapidly declining. As membership declines our insurance cost increases. Membership average age is 80 years old. Lack of visibility in our communities. State officers predict SIR will not exist in 5 to 7 years without making some changes. Some of the changes being considered; Eliminate the term "Retirement". Change the organization's name and logo to better reflect our vision and purpose. Change "Branch" to "Chapter". Change "Big Sir" to "President" and "Little Sir" to "V.P." Change slogan from "Social Activities for Men" to "Enhance Your Lifestyle" and "Friends for Life". Our next BEC business meeting will be held at Suju's coffee on August 7 at 10:30am.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:02.

History of the National Football League

The National Football League (NFL) was founded in 1920 as the American Professional Football Association (APFA) with ten teams from four states, all of whom existed in some form as participants of regional leagues in their respective territories. The league took on its current name in 1922. The NFL was the first professional football league to successfully establish a nationwide presence, after several decades of failed attempts. Only two founding members are still in the league, the Decatur Staleys (now the Chicago Bears) and the Chicago Cardinals (founded in 1898, joined the NFL in 1920, now the Arizona Cardinals) is the oldest NFL franchise.

League membership gradually stabilized throughout the 1920s and 1930s as the league adopted progressively more formal organization. The first official championship game was held in 1933. The NFL stopped signing black players in 1927 but reintegrated in 1946 following World War II. Other changes followed after the war; the office of league President evolved into the more powerful Commissioner post, mirroring a similar move in Major League Baseball. Teams became more financially viable, the last team folding in 1952 and the league absorbing teams from the briefly more successful All-America Football Conference in 1950, of which only the San Francisco 49ers and the Cleveland Browns survive. By 1958, when that season's NFL championship game became known as "the most exciting game ever played", the NFL was on its way to becoming one of the most popular sports leagues in the United States.

The rival American Football League was founded in 1960. It was very successful, and forced a merger with the older NFL that resulted in a greatly expanded league and the creation of the Super Bowl, which has become the most-watched annual sporting event in the United States. The league continued to expand to its current 32 teams. A series of labor agreements during the 1990s and increasingly large television contracts have helped keep the league one of the most profitable in the U.S., and the only major league in the U.S. since 1990 to avoid a work stoppage that resulted in the loss of regular-season games.
