Horace Hines

Geology from the Pacific to the Rockies



Horace Hines will be talking about "Geology from the Pacific to the Rockies". This will be a description of how the major geologic formations from the Pacific Ocean to the Rockies were formed. Have you ever wondered why there is a coastal range followed by the great valley and then the Sierras? Why

is the decent from the Sierra summit down to Reno steeper than the rise from the Sacramento Valley to the summit? How were the rounded Sierra granite mountain tops (like Half Dome) formed? What created the Great Basin where rivers go to die? What forces created the Rockies?

Horace Hines, Ph. D (Past Big SIR for Branch 54) He received his bachelor's degree in physics from Auburn University in Alabama and his doctorate in Biophysics from UC Davis. Horace was the Hospital Physicist and Radiation Safety officer at the University of California, Davis Medical Center. He worked for ADAC Laboratories and Philips Medical in the field of Nuclear Medicine. He led teams who designed and marketed medical imaging equipment including gamma cameras, PET scanners and PET-CT. Horace has varied interests and curiosity about many subjects. He enjoys learning, applying his physics knowledge and using it to understand and explain mysteries.

Rob asked whether we felt our monthly business meetings were worth while and should be continued. We agreed they were and decided to continue meeting at 10:30 - 12:00 on the first Wednesday of each month at Suju's Coffee on Thornton Ave.

Bill Bauhofer will be directing which tables go up for lunch today. After a brief discussion we decided, when calling members with mobility issues to go up first, the whole table where he is sitting should go up as well.

Jerry Sabo will be moving out of state soon. We discussed how important his leadership has been to Branch 59. As Director, Pathfinder Editor, maintaining our database, roster and audio visual equipment and leader of the Cyber Geezer group. As well, Jerry has been the editor of the SIR State newsletter, *SIR Happenings*, since August 2018. We thank Jerry for his involvement with Branch 59.

Sammy Lum offered to update our roster. It will be available to members on-line on our web site. After a discussion about offering a hard copy of the roster to members who want one, a motion was made to offer a color roster to any member requesting one for \$10 each. The motion was approved.

On a Clear Day....and It was a Clear Day!

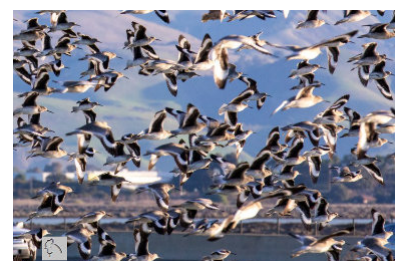
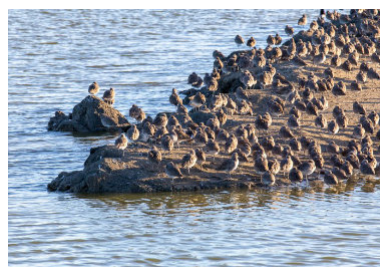
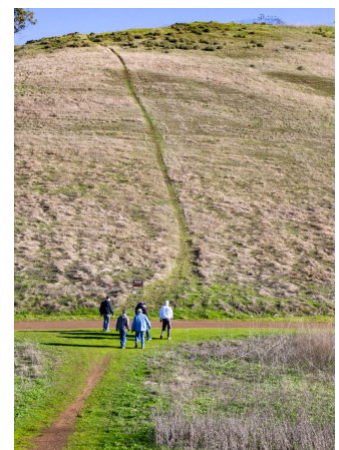
