Eric Jones was one of two recipients of the Medal of Valor from President Bush for his service to our country during the events of 9/11. His experience left him with mental health challenges, including PTSD. Eric used his passion for mental health to start a nonprofit, Sea Valor, with the purpose of improving the quality of life for those with mental health challenges through sailing.

Bio: Eric grew up in the Bay Area, his mother a social worker, and his father an Air Force Colonel. Eric felt compelled to help people from an early age and became an EMT as soon as he turned 18. That led to him joining the Prince George's County Fire Department where he received additional training in firefighting, search and rescue, hazardous materials, and rescue diving. Eric continued by earning his Paramedic certification, and in 1998 graduated from The George Washington University (GWU) with a BS in Health Sciences, with a focus on Emergency Medical Services with a minor in Psychology.

The meeting was called to order by Big Sir Rob Perrill at 10:00 am. All BEC members were present except Bob Marshall and Fred Serena.

In his opening remarks, Big Sir Rob Perrill shared his concern with the RSVP process for our monthly luncheons. He also spoke of the need to develop a succession plan for BEC members and involve more members as assistants in the various tasks which help our branch to run effectively. Rob suggested we consider incorporating a pledge with our new members as is done at other branches, which would include being friendly, bringing guests and volunteering.

Signature authorizations for our bank account have been changed to include Rob Perrill and Rick Henry and removing Ingy. Larry is preparing to pay our quarterly assessment to SIR State, due mid-April. Regarding dues, 122 members have paid their 2025 membership dues, 6 members have indicated they are dropping their membership for a variety of reasons and 13 members have not yet paid their dues.

Membership: Rob Ingebretson reported we expect to welcome two new members today, Charlie Peeler and Alan Claassen. We approved their membership in Branch 59. We also expect to see 5 guests at today's luncheon.

Attendance: Ken Brunskill reported there are a number of members who do not RSVP to our luncheon meetings, making it difficult to plan for the correct amount of food. We discussed incorporating the use of an online invite tool once again, as we have in the past.

A new rental agreement with the Elks Lodge has been signed as well as insurance forms with Elks and our caterer for 2025 are complete. Rick Henry offered to assume responsibility for keeping these up to date going forward.

Jim Ulam has stepped down as Recruitment Chairman. We will seek a volunteer to take this role.

Fred Serena has stepped down as Activities Coordinator. We discussed whether this position needs to be filled.

A motion was made to approve Fred Serena as a Director of Branch 59. The motion was approved unanimously. Fred remains Area Representative of Branch 59 as well as Branches 2, 34, 101 and 128.

Sweetheart Luncheon: Elvis will be joining us on May 21. Tickets go on sale today. There will be door prizes to be raffled and a fun time for all.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:00 am.

Meet our New Member

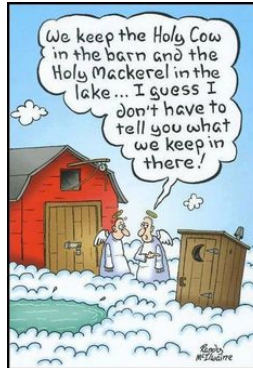
