Carlo Facchino

Solo Ocean Row to Hawaii



During the summer of 2022 on a cold and foggy July morning, Carlo Facchino climbed into a 19 foot ocean rowing boat and headed west underneath the Golden Gate Bridge. After 72 days at sea he reached the Big

Island of Hawaii where he was greeted by friends and family.

**Biography:** Carlo Facchino was born and raised in San Jose, CA. He was introduced to the sport of rowing as a freshman at the University of California Davis. Prior to his solo row, Carlo successfully completed ocean crossings of the Pacific Ocean and the Arctic Ocean as part of a team. He holds numerous Guinness World Records including a record for the northernmost latitude ever reached by a rowing boat.

The meeting was called to order by Big Sir Rob Perrill at 10:02am. All BEC members were present.

The first order of business was a **motion** made by Rob Perrill to approve Ron Singler as a Director on the Branch Executive Committee in Branch 59. The motion was approved unanimously. Ron will be the Chairman of the Nominating Committee.

The January 15, 2025 meeting minutes were approved as presented. Minutes for a special meeting held on February 11 were also approved as presented. The purpose for that meeting was to discuss and plan for the Sweetheart Luncheon we will hold on May 21.

Treasurer, Larry Lardie reported the balance of our account was \$9,687.88 as of February 19. The treasurer's report was approved. Larry discussed in detail the line items on Form 28, the Monthly Cash Report, and how he reconciles our bank account. Form 28 is sent to SIR State each month. A Branch Audit Report, Form 29, is completed every year and sent to SIR State in February. This task was completed on February 14 by Carl Nordling. A **motion** was made to accept the Audit Report for the year 2024. The motion was approved.

Fred Serena asked for clarification regarding our cash reserves. SIR State suggests cash reserves at year end should be \$20 to \$25 per member. Larry shared a spreadsheet he created to track annual cash flow for each year beginning in 2021. Our ending balance per member in 2024 was \$48. Our projected year end balance per member in 2025 is also \$48.

A **motion** was made to create an inventory listing all material assets owned by Branch 59. The list is to include who is responsible for the item and where it is stored. The motion was approved.

A **motion** was made to accept the new list of Committee Chairmen and Assistants. The motion was approved. This list will be included in our new roster which will be published soon.

The new Roster; Last month we approved a motion to offer a color roster to any member requesting one for \$10 each. This was based on past prices. Currently the cost for a color copy of the roster would be \$20. A **motion** was made to offer a hard copy, black and white roster to any member requesting one for \$10 each. The motion was approved. The roster will be emailed to each member who has an email address and they are free to print a hard copy should they choose.

Bank Signage Authority; A **motion** was made to add Rob Perrill, Big Sir and Rick Henry, Little Sir, as signatories on our US BANK account "SONS IN RETIREMENT INC. #59". And also to remove as signatory, Rob Ingebretson. The motion was approved.

Membership; Rob Ingebretson made a **motion** to approve Don Upchurch as a new member to Branch 59. The motion was approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:00.

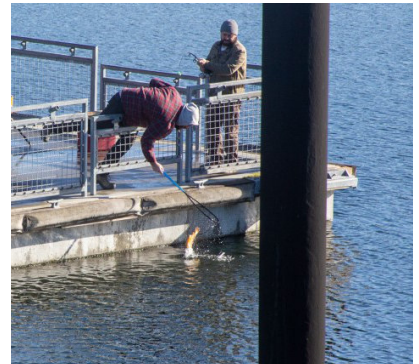
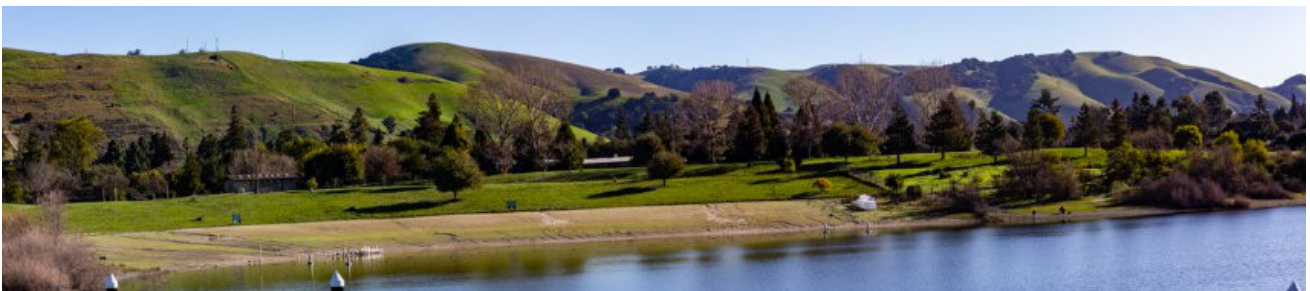
## ***I Left My Sole (sole of my right shoe) in San Fran...er, Fremont***

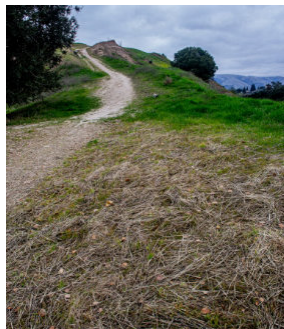

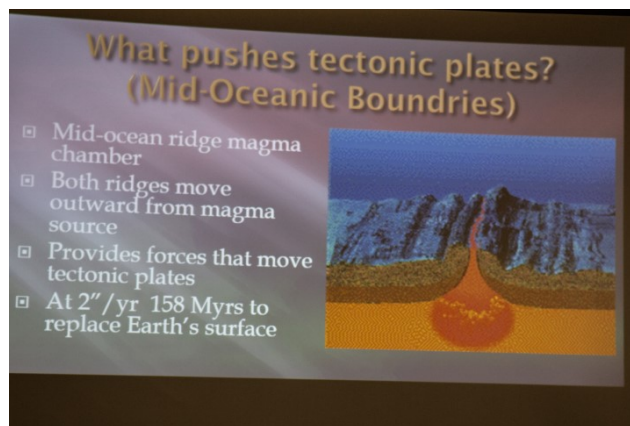

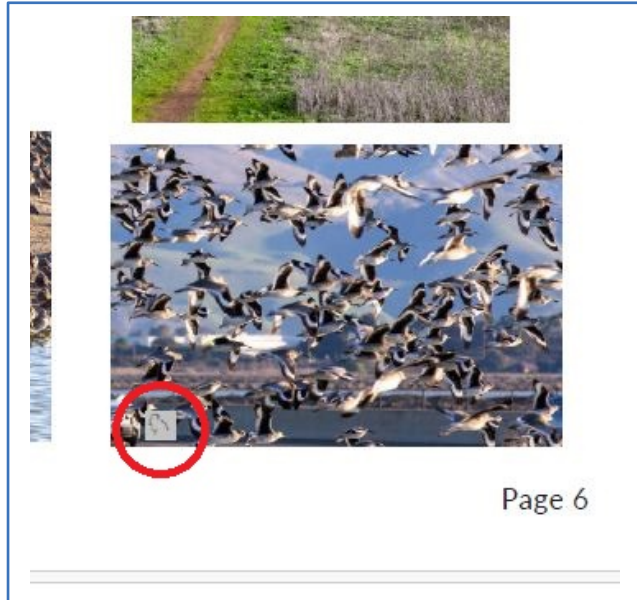
