

The meeting was called to order by Rob Perrill at 10:00 am. All BEC members were present.

In his opening remarks, Rob congratulated and thanked Ken Brunskill for his work investigating and testing several on-line RSVP tools for inviting members to our third Wednesday luncheons. Regarding succession planning, someone mentioned the difficulty they have had recruiting volunteers. This prompted a robust discussion and led to a list of several positive actions we will be taking to interest members in

becoming more involved.

Branch 59 is part of Area 15, along with Branches 2, 34, 101 and 128. We have the honor of being the home Branch of the Area 15 Representative, Fred Serena. Fred held a meeting of Area 15 Branches where Rob Perrill represented our Branch. Rob reported he found the meeting very helpful, good communications and that many Branches shared common challenges.

Secretary: The March 19, 2025 meeting minutes were approved as presented. Requests to amend the SIR Branch Bylaws are to be submitted each year in March. These bylaws are included in the SIR Manual, a 106 page document. The bylaws have been copied from the Manual and the BEC will look at them in detail and discuss possible amendments we would like to see incorporated in the future during our May 7 business meeting.

Treasurer: Larry Lardie reported the balance of our account was \$10,488.75 as of April 16. Our quarterly assessment, \$368.50, was paid at the end of March. The treasurer's report was approved.

Membership: Rob Ingebretson reported we expect to welcome three new members today, Charlie Peeler, Vasu Kadambi and Vance Hamilton. We approved their membership in Branch 59. We also expect 1 guest to join us today, Bob Parks, sponsored by Larry Jett.

Attendance: Ken Brunskill reported that 96 members responded to the lunch invitation and we expect 86 to attend. Ken has tested the use of Mixily and SignUpGenius as RSVP tools to use for inviting members to our luncheons. The BEC have been the test subjects and we will be evaluating our experiences as host and invitees before we launch a new tool.

Area Representative: Fred Serena reported a SIR State Board Meeting will be held on April 24. Items on their agenda include considering four amendments to policies or bylaws and adoption of four new policies.

Publicity: Bob Marshall shared an eight point Plan of Action for 2025 and a proposed budget of \$910. The action plans created a lively discussion and a list of additional plans we may wish to consider and methods to act on them. A motion was made to approve Bob's initial budget of \$910. The motion was approved.

Policy 41, from the SIR Manual, refers to the sale of advertising space in a SIR Branch Bulletin such as our Pathfinder. A motion was made to pursue selling business ad space in our Pathfinder publication, abiding by the rules set out in Policy 41. The motion was approved.

Rob Ingebretson recognized Daniel Johnson for his work printing hard copies of the new member directory with color photographs. Daniel has donated his time, talent and material to this project and we give him our thanks

A motion was made to charge members who wish a color, hard copy of the directory \$10. The motion was approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:08 am.


Sir John Vickroy, the Song Leader for Branch 59, led the members in a stirring performance of "Sweet Caroline."


