


### Addressing Wildfire Risks



# How We Are Helping Our Unhoused Community

#### INITIATIVES TO SUPPORT OUR UNHOUSED COMMUNITY:

- Authorized \$389,000 in additional funding for Adobe Services' Sunrise Village Shelter, over next 2 years
- Operated Winter Relief Program with 27 rooms, providing 43 individuals/families with seasonal shelter and supportive services.
- Awarded Three Valleys Community Foundation \$128,669 to provide unhoused individuals affected by the opioid crisis with referrals to substance use disorder providers and services









### The Four-Year Impact of Our Housing Navigation Center (HNC)





In partnership with Bay Area Community Services (BACS), the HNC served 279 people. Of everyone served, 60% of people who left the program, went into stable housing.

- Streamlined the permitting process for construction projects involving historic homes.
- Updated the Fremont Municipal Code and City policies to reflect changes in State law and support City goals.
- Enacted a new Short-Term Rental Ordinance, holding hosts accountable for obtaining City permits and for being good neighbors.

Planting a Greener Future:

2,100+ Trees Planted



Planted 178 trees in 4 Fremont schools, with 250+ additional trees to be planted this year at 4 more schools.



Started citywide grid tree pruning program, resulting in 300+ trees safely pruned in 2024.



Collaborated with Urban Forest Friends and Rotary for additional tree plantings.

- Central Park Babbling Brook Bridge Renovation To accommodate increased costs and scope modifications
