


Craige Edgerton

"Permission to Walk in Peace"



Craige served in the United States Marine Corps from 1968 to 1971, including 7 months in Vietnam, where he experienced combat. He is here to talk about his book, "Permission to Walk in Peace," an anthology he co-authored with seven other Veterans. It is 106 stories, essays, and poems about their recovery from Post Traumatic Stress (PTSD) from their time in the military and how they have chosen to grow from their experience instead of being victims of it.

BIO :Craige Edgerton has lived in San Jose for over 50 years and has been involved in the community in various ways. He has been an active member of the West San Jose Kiwanis Club for 44 of those years and has also been very active in the environmental movement in Santa Clara County since 1994, primarily with the Santa Clara Valley Open Space Authority. He is an amateur naturalist and leads birding and wildflower hikes for multiple organizations. He and his wife, Jan, have two daughters—one who graduated from Lincoln High School and the other from Los Gatos High School—and three grandchildren.

The meeting was called to order by Big Sir Rick Henry at 10:00 am. All BEC members were present. Rick welcomed us into the new year, reflecting on the strength of our branch over the last year under the strong leadership of Rob Perrill. He emphasized the importance of communication among the BEC, Executive Branch Committee, and the entire branch membership.

Secretary: The November 19, 2025 meeting minutes were approved as presented. Per the Schedule of Branch Operations we will install the 2026 BEC Officers today, the Big Sir will communicate goals and action plans for the year, the Treasurer will send the first quarter assessment to SIR State and our annual audit should be complete by Feb 10.

Treasurer: Larry Lardie reported the balance of our account was \$5,108.95 as of January 20. The quarterly assessment has been sent to SIR State. Michael Shapiro will conduct the annual audit with Larry's assistance. There are additional budgetary requirements we need to provide SIR State. We will be budgeting our marketing, advertising and membership expenses and plan for a reserve of \$40 per member at year end. The treasurer's report was approved.

Big Sir: Rick is working with our caterer to complete the necessary insurance forms for 2026. Regarding job descriptions, Rick asked each BEC member to write a simple description of the tasks they perform each month. This will be extremely helpful if a member were not able to attend a meeting. It will also be important for future leaders fulfilling these roles.

Little Sir: Ken is working with the ELKs Lodge to complete our contract with them for 2026. The Sunrise Breakfast Bunch met on January 13 when 17 members and partners enjoyed great camaraderie and good food together.

SIR State President: Fred Serena will be chairing the first board meeting of 2026 this coming Friday. There are many items on their agenda, including golf and bowling activities at SIR Branches and development of new Branches in Southern California. Two Branches have recently closed, bringing the number of SIR Branches to 76.

Membership: Rob Ingebretson reported three new members will join us today. Bruce Hedlund, Jim Westfall and Ron McGlaughlin. Their membership in Branch 59 was approved. We also expect two guests to join us today. Rob Perrill indicated his interest in speaking with new members regarding their interests in different activities offered by our branch.

Attendance: Craig reported 94 members indicated they would attend today's meeting. With guests we expect to serve 99 lunches.

Activities: Ron Singler indicated strong attendance in Bocce Ball, Walkers, Poker, Wine Tasting and our newest Sunshine Breakfast Bunch. Cyber Geezers is a small group, but keeps going. The Golf and Bowling groups are currently inactive.

Publicity: Bob Marshall will meet with the publicity team next week to plan the goals for 2026. Bob also announced he intends to begin a "Debate Club", which will meet following today's luncheon.

Mark Silvera was our Assistant Treasurer in 2025 and acted in behalf of our treasurer during the later part of 2025 while dealing with medical issues. Mark is now absent due to medical issues of his own. A motion was made that Michael Shapiro become the Assistant Treasurer for Branch 59. The motion was approved.

A motion was made to allow for up to \$30 be spent to scan new membership applications. The motion was approved.


The meeting was adjourned at 11:00 am.

AFFORDABLE LYFT RIDES FOR YOUR LOCAL TRAVEL NEEDS!

Lin Palmer is thrilled with her newfound freedom. As someone who identified as "technology challenged", she never thought she would use her smartphone for anything other than phone calls. After learning how to use the Lyft app and taking Lyft rides to and from dialysis, she proclaimed "Where has this service been all my life!"



Lin was initially hesitant to sign up for Ride-On Tri-City's subsidized Lyft service. She was worried that the drivers wouldn't help to stow her walker or that she would make a mistake requesting a ride through the app. Lin's concerns were eased after learning that Ride-On Tri-City had provided 81,000+ subsidized Lyft rides over the past five years, and that the program's frequent riders included individuals in their 90s as well as young adults who are blind.

Lin was surprised how easy it was to request rides through the app. She pays \$4 per ride and can take up to 30 subsidized rides per month. The biggest benefit of the service according to Lin: "I request my ride and 5-10 minutes later, my Lyft ride arrives. No more waiting around!"
