



Join environmental writer and award-winning marine wildlife photographer Kim Steinhart for a photographic journey into California coast's past, present, and probable future, exploring the sometimes-troubled relationship between humans and nature. This

Mr. Steinhart is recognized as a "keen observer, a wonderful storyteller, and a remarkable photographer" for his work educating and inspiring people of all ages about ocean stewardship and wildlife conservation. He has contributed to National Geographic's *Explore My World* series and other wildlife publications, and his



books include *The Edge: The Pressured Past and Precarious Future of California's Coast*, and a children's book called *Sabby the Sea Otter: A Pup's True Adventure and Triumph*.

The meeting was called to order by Big Sir Rick Henry at 10:00 am. All BEC members were present except Bob Marshall.

Secretary: The January 21, 2026 meeting minutes were approved as presented. All BEC members have turned in a Conflict of Interest Form except Bob Marshall and Michael Shapiro. They will each be emailed a copy of the form.

Treasurer: Larry Lardie reported the balance of our account was \$8,691.57 as of February 15. Michael Shapiro completed the Branch 59 Audit Report for 2025. Dues was collected from 62 members during our January meeting, totaling \$3,720. The first quarter assessment of \$404 has been sent to SIR State. We briefly discussed pro-rating dues paid by new members. A motion was made that we reduce the dues we charge new members by \$5 each month, ie, \$55 in February, \$50 in March, etc. The motion was approved.

Big Sir: Rick is pleased with the number of job descriptions that have been submitted. The insurance form with our caterer is complete and submitted to the SIR Insurance Chairman. Our contract with the ELKs Lodge for 2026 has been completed. Rick and Ken attended training meetings on Jan 30 and Feb 6. They both thought the meetings were interesting and informative. Rick noted the Branch Advisory Council meets on the 2nd Friday of each month.

Little Sir: Ken reported today's guest speaker is Craig Edgerton who will discuss issues with PTSD which veterans deal with. 16 people of the Sunrise Breakfast Bunch met on February 10 at the Black Bear Diner. On January 30 fourteen members of the Fun Bunch met at Harry's Hofbrau for lunch, followed by a visit to the Chabot Space and Science Center. Ken is hosting a meeting at his home for several BEC members to consider the use of electronic conferencing tools like WhatsApp to facilitate discussions outside our regular meeting times.

SIR State President: Fred Serena shared several topics which SIR State is currently considering or implementing. The Branch Advisory Council has developed a new format for the newsletter SIR Happening. It will focus solely on activities. State Board meetings will be held on the 4th Friday each month. Board meeting minutes will be sent to Big Sirs to forward to their teams. A new AI tool is being considered for use by secretaries. Named PLAUD, it will use a recording of a BEC meeting to generate minutes of that meeting. An image approval form is being developed. This form would allow a member's photo to be used, or forbid to be used in an external publication.

Social: Rob asked for opinions about the entertainment we will feature during our Sweetheart Luncheon in May. After several options were discussed we decided on a Hawaiian theme. Rick has contacts with Hawaiian dancers and will investigate and report possible offerings.

Membership: Rob Ingebretson reported one new member will join us today. Alfonso Liongson. His membership in Branch 59 was approved. We also expect one guest to join us today. Our current membership number is 149. This assumes all of last years members renew their membership this year.

Attendance: Craig reported we expect 99 members and guests will attend today's meeting.

Activities: Ron Singler reported the bowling group is not compliant with SIR rules and we cannot consider bowling a legitimate activity. The golfing group has stalled without a chairperson. Ron has spoken with the individual golfers, who continue to golf independently, not as a group. Ron has several ideas, which, if implemented may fulfill requirements of SIR State and allow us to list golf as an activity at Branch 59.

Publicity: Roger Marshall, member of the publicity team, asked for motion allowing his team to spend \$910 for an advertisement in the Tri-City-Voice in 2026. A motion was made and approved by the BEC.

Ken Brunskill made a motion to include the FUN BUNCH and the SUNRISE BREAKFAST BUNCH as official activities in Branch 59. The motion was approved by the BEC.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:06 am.






You may have noticed that our birthday procedure has changed. If it is your birthday month you are to pick up a lei in the box located next to the gentleman that gives you your badge when you enter.



Our alternate route between Rainbow Lake and Horseshoe Lake gave me the chance to take photos of the lakes at the foot (not really) of the mountains. That's where the views of Mission peak happened. I doubt that Sammy has the room in the Pathfinder for all of them, but maybe he can squeeze in a couple or so. I think other cameras captured the best views of we thirteen walkers. I did get a couple. Also, Thor was with us again; we encountered Canada geese, a scrub jay, ducks, a few fishermen, a helicopter and other walkers that Wednesday.

ABLE LYFT RIDES FOR CAL TRAVEL NEEDS!



AFFORDABLE LYFT RIDES FOR YOUR LOCAL TRAVEL NEEDS!

Lin Palmer is thrilled with her newfound freedom. As someone who identified as "technology challenged", she never thought she would use her smartphone for anything other than phone calls. After learning how to use the Lyft app and taking Lyft rides to and from dialysis, she proclaimed "Where has this service been all my life!"



Lin was initially hesitant to sign up for Ride-On Tri-City's subsidized Lyft service. She was worried that the drivers wouldn't help to stow her walker or that she would make a mistake requesting a ride through the app. Lin's concerns were eased after learning that Ride-On Tri-City had provided 81,000+ subsidized Lyft rides over the past five years, and that the program's frequent riders included individuals in their 90's as well as young adults who are blind.

Lin was surprised how easy it was to request rides through the app. She pays \$4 per ride and can take up to 30 subsidized rides per month. The biggest benefit of the service according to Lin: "I request my ride and 5-10 minutes later, my Lyft ride arrives. No more waiting around!"
