The meeting was called to order by Big Sir Rick Henry at 10:00 am. All BEC members were present except Nat Lord.

Secretary: The March 18, 2026 meeting minutes were approved as presented. One correspondence from SIR State was regarding who we will contract with to make our SIR pins and name tags. The prior vendor is no longer in business.

Treasurer: Larry Lardie reported the balance of our account was \$9,236.78 as of April 12. The 2nd quarter assessment of \$404.70 has been sent to SIR State. So far we have received dues from 120 members. The treasurer's report was approved.

Big Sir: Rick mentioned he recently attended a Branch Advisory Council Meeting. Fourteen current and past Big Sirs were present. Some of the take-aways of the meeting included: The average age of SIR membership is 78 years old. Everyone agreed with the need to keep up with technology changes. Responsibilities of area representatives includes visiting many branches and sharing practices and ideas which work well, a somewhat daunting job. Some suggest more people be involved in this process. Our Little Sir, Ken Brunskill, was recognized by the Advisory Council for his organizational skills in Branch 59. Minutes from these Advisory Council Meetings will be made available to all membership.

Little Sir: Ken reported today's guest speaker will be our own Bob Marshall, stepping in for the planned presenter who could not make it. The Sunrise Breakfast Bunch was well attended this month. They meet on the 2nd Tuesday each month. Ken is also organizing the Fun Bunch trip to the Sacramento Railroad museum.

Nominating: Rob Perrill is actively looking for members interested in becoming more involved in management of our branch. We are in need of a recruitment chairman and a Director.

Ken Brunskill nominated Randy Patterson for the position of Director on the Board Executive Committee of Branch 59. The BEC voted, unanimously, to approve him as a member of the board.

Membership: Ingy reported we have two new members joining us today. Greg Moller and Vin Sahni. Their membership in Branch 59 was approved. We also expect one guest to join us today. Larry Lardie shared his list of members who have not yet paid dues for 2026. Some on this list are expected to pay their dues today. We will discuss this issue further during the May 6 business meeting at Suju's.

Membership Roster: Several people have shown interest in having a hard copy of our roster. It will be available electronically to everyone with an email account. There will be hard copies available to members who wish it.

Social: Ingy reported Bill Bauhofer and Jerry Ford are selling tickets for our May Sweetheart luncheon. The theme will be Hawaiian with a special guest presenting four different cultures of the Hawaiian Islands. Her charge will be \$350. The BEC approved this expense.

Attendance: Craig reported we expect 92 members and guests to attend today's meeting.

Activities: Ron Singler reported Bocce Ball, Poker, Walkers, Day Trips, Breakfast Bunch and Wine Tasting are all well attended.

Publicity: Bob Marshall and team are looking forward to participating in several activities this year, including Niles Day, Concerts in the Park and Newark Days.

Credit Card Reader: The thought of taking payments for dues or luncheons via credit or ATM card has been brought up several times. Secretary Dave offered to research the possibilities of making this possible.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:55am.

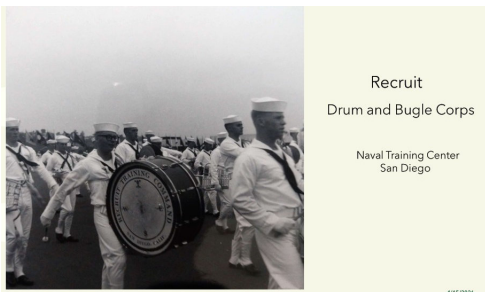

AFFORDABLE LYFT RIDES FOR YOUR LOCAL TRAVEL NEEDS!

Lin Palmer is thrilled with her newfound freedom. As someone who identified as "technology challenged", she never thought she would use her smartphone for anything other than phone calls. After learning how to use the Lyft app and taking Lyft rides to and from dialysis, she proclaimed "Where has this service been all my life!"

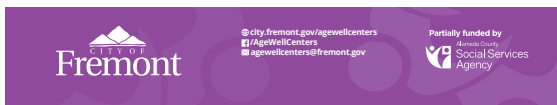


Lin was initially hesitant to sign up for Ride-On Tri-City's subsidized Lyft service. She was worried that the drivers wouldn't help to stow her walker or that she would make a mistake requesting a ride through the app. Lin's concerns were eased after learning that Ride-On Tri-City had provided 81,000+ subsidized Lyft rides over the past five years, and that the program's frequent riders included individuals in their 90s as well as young adults who are blind.

Lin was surprised how easy it was to request rides through the app. She pays \$4 per ride and can take up to 30 subsidized rides per month. The biggest benefit of the service according to Lin: "I request my ride and 5-10 minutes later, my Lyft ride arrives. No more waiting around!"
